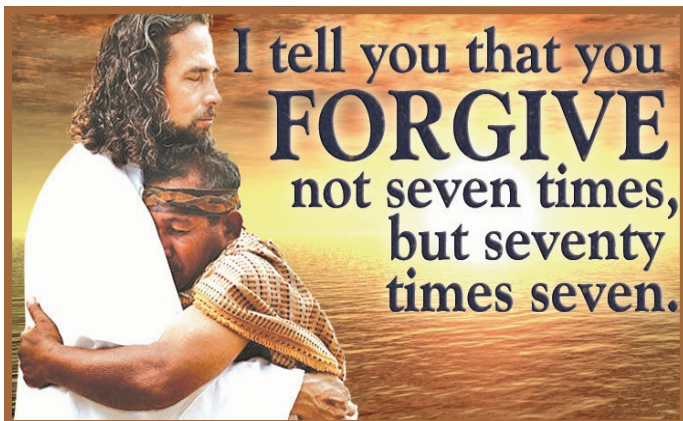

Craig's Corner

A Note from our Director of Music

Our central focus of love and forgiveness from last week's readings continue this weekend as we hear about the mercy and forgiveness of God. The first reading from Sirach prefigures Jesus' teaching on forgiveness in the Gospel and our Psalm this weekend focuses on the kindness and mercy of God. And so, our hymns praise our God and King for his mercy and echo the sentiments brought forth in the readings this weekend. In our opening hymn, *Praise My Soul the King of Heaven*, we praise our King, who knows our feeble frame, who knows our need for forgiveness, and so his mercy flows beyond ranges that we know. At offertory, in the hymn *Forgive our Sins as We Forgive*, we sing the theme of this weekend's Gospel. We pray St. Francis' words at communion asking God to make us instruments of peace, and as we conclude our celebration, thank God for all of his gifts of love and mercy so that we may be empowered to spread those gifts of peace, love and mercy to those we meet in the coming week.

During our festival this past summer, I was able to present our basilica's pipe organ to visitors and parishioners who took the basilica tours. I gave them a history of the instrument and talked about the mechanics of the instrument. In coming weeks of *Craig's Corner*, I will be writing on that aspect of our wonderful basilica.

As a prelude to this, it is the wishes of the traditional Church that the instrument of the organ be given proper place in Catholic worship. Church documents written about the organ state:

"Among all other instruments which are suitable for divine worship, the organ is 'accorded pride of place' because of its capacity to sustain the singing of a large gathered assembly, due to both its size and its ability to give 'resonance to the fullness of human sentiments, from joy to sadness, from praise to lamentation.' Likewise, 'the manifold possibilities of the organ in some way remind us of the immensity and the magnificence of God.'"

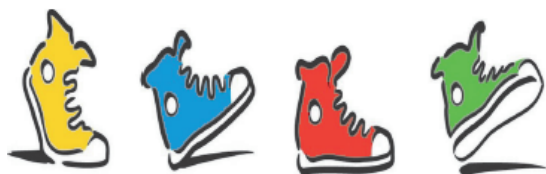
