











<u>Craig's Corner</u> A Note from our Director of Music


Continuing from last week's history of the organs of the basilica, I left off just before discussing the history of the organ we have today. In 1987, the Pittsburgh Organ Company in charge of the prior instrument assessed the need for massive repairs. Father Cariglio, with the help of parish council and the music director at the time, sought the advice of several distinguished organ companies and it was the Peebles-Herzog Company of Columbus who was awarded the contract for the restoration and expansion of our pipe organ. The bequest of the late John A. Cafaro of \$25,000 earmarked for the restoration of the organ, in addition to the finance committee and parish council making an appeal to the parish members and societies for \$70,000 for this project. By July 1989, the appeal exceeded the goal by \$6,500 for the total sum of \$101,500. On August 16, 1989, the organ was disassembled for rebuilding in the Columbus studio. Forty-two parishioners at the time were able to make the trip to Columbus to witness part of the rebuilding process in Columbus. The organ was installed beginning on October 23, 1989 and dedicated at Masses on the weekend of November 26, 1989 – the Feast of Christ the King.

The organ was used in full capacity until the mid-2000s when the organ sustained major damage to the electronics due to a lightning strike. This forced the reconstruction of the computer system which allows the keyboards of the instrument to "speak to" the pipes to create the sound, completed in 2006. With this, I will hold off until next week when I will discuss the mechanics of how a pipe organ produces sound.
