






IN THIS YEAR OF MARY Our Lady, Refuge of Sinners

<u>Craig's Corner</u> A Note from our Director of Music

When we gather as a congregation at Mass, most often we begin with an entrance hymn or the antiphon for the day. Church documents on music explain that "the purpose of this chant is to open the celebration, foster the unity of those who have been gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical season or festivity, and accompany the procession of the priest and ministers."

As stated, there are two ways this is normally done: either an opening hymn, or the entrance antiphon. The antiphon is taken directly from the Roman Missal, where all the prayers for every Mass are also found. Altar servers know this book as the big heavy red book they hold for the celebrant at Mass. Since this antiphon is taken directly from the Mass for the day, as it fulfills the above direction of what role the entrance chant plays in the Liturgy, while its text sets the tone for the readings and prayers to come. The other option for an entrance chant is of course, an opening hymn. The opening hymn, however, must keep with the purpose of the chant and approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops.

I like to hold to our Church's long-standing tradition of entrance antiphons from time to time, which can be accompanied with psalm or scriptural verses also. This weekend's opening procession is accompanied by the entrance chant and subsequent psalm verses. Our Gospel today speaks of humility. We are to build up the kingdom of God on earth, or as our offertory hymn today proclaims, to walk as children of the light, but must do so with humility. If we call on the name of Jesus as our entrance antiphon acclaims, "come to my help" we can live out this humble nature in our day-to-day lives.

Philip Joseph Pillin has recently completed formation to become a Leader of Prayer for Our Lady of Mount Carmel Basilica-St. Anthony of Padua Parish and also, Walsh University. A Leader of Prayer is a lay person commissioned to lead the faithful in acts of worship which in the past were often led by ordained clergy but which are not reserved exclusively to them.

The formation for this ministry consists of an eight-week series conducted by the diocese. The course addresses the verbal and non-verbal elements of presiding at prayer as well as the structure of the various forms of prayer he may be called upon to lead.

Philip Joseph Pillin may be asked to lead Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer, Liturgy of the Word, Wake Services, the Rite of Committal, devotions such as novenas and Stations the Cross, minor rites within the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

According to diocesan directives, Leaders of Prayer are to be vested in an alb for all services conducted within the church building. The alb is a white garment, a baptismal garment. It is traditionally the garb of the people and not specifically clerical vesture. When the baptized put on the alb to minister in the liturgy, it becomes clear that they are doing so in virtue of their baptism and their share in the priesthood of Christ.

Philip Joseph Pillin is commended for the dedication and enthusiasm with which he responded to the call to take part in this ministry. When you have the opportunity you might thank him for the service he is giving to our parish.


