What wonders God has done! Let us thank the God who heals us and calls us to communion with Christ.





Craig's Corner A Note from our Director of Music

This weekend's Responsorial Psalm, Psalm 128, acclaims: "Blessed are those who fear the Lord." Fear of the Lord is one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit we receive at Confirmation. But what exactly is it? Also referred to as Wonder and Awe, it does not mean for us to be scared of God, but rather to respect God's all-powerful majesty and to be fearful to do anything against God's will.

The readings and music this weekend open before us God's majesty but also God's power; they are a good bridge between last weekend's call to vigilance for the second coming of Christ and next weekend's solemnity of Christ as King of the Universe. This weekend's Gospel reminds us it is God's will for us to use the spiritual and worldly gifts we have been given to share with others, for if we don't we will be thrown into the darkness. St. Paul preaches on this darkness in his letter to the Thessalonians, as he touches on a theme from last weekend – vigilance – that those who are not vigilant are in darkness and cannot escape the wrath. Rather, when we rely on Christ, we are in the light. If we latch onto the fear of the Lord, we will be alert and prepared, and we will strive towards doing God's will.

The prelude this weekend, the German chorale, "If Thou but Suffer God to Guide Thee" is the common denominator to these readings. The text of the chorale centers on not allowing any pains of this world to detract us from our goal of heaven. This heavenly Jerusalem, the focus of these last days of Ordinary Time, is the theme of Psalm 122, sung during the opening procession. The other psalm sung this weekend, at Communion, calls for the gifts of the Spirit (including fear of the Lord) to be poured upon us to renew the face of the earth. The postlude this weekend dwells on the dark side of this weekend's readings, for Jesus tells us if we do not follow his way, but rather that of the wicked servants, there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. During this Year of Mary, our offertory hymn calls upon her also to be our hope, nostra speranza. With Mary's help, may we not bury our gifts like the wicked servant, but rather use them to praise the Lord's great majesty and be a light to this dark world!



From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ.

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church:</u> An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

- May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
- 2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
- 3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
- 4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
- 5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
- 6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.
