

<u>Craig's corner</u> A Note from our Director of Music

God bestows so many great gifts on us. When something good happens to us, the first thing we want to do is tell everyone of our good fortune, or whatever it is that we are given or are celebrating. That is exactly the case which we hear of in today's Gospel reading of the leper who was cured of his disease. We hear in the first reading what people thought of those with leprosy at that time in history: it wasn't just a disease – it was thought of those stricken with the disease that they were unclean. Even though he was told not to, he publicized his being made clean to everyone. While perhaps not to this scale, we receive many blessings from God and we should be ever thankful for this; thus we sing our offertory hymn this weekend, *Ti Ringrazio*, *O Mio Signore* ("I Give Thanks to You, O My God").

A word that we hear repeated often in this hymn is *alleluia*. This word, which is an exclamation of praise or rejoicing, is heard all during the church year with the exception of one season: Lent. On Wednesday, we begin this penitential season where the word *alleluia* will be withheld from liturgical celebrations until the Easter Vigil. It leaves a certain void in our celebrations as we seek God's mercy and forgiveness so that our lives are renewed when we are washed away from sin in the waters of new baptism at Easter. Another noticeable change in Mass will be the absence of the Gloria except on solemnities. These joyful things that are taken away during Lent are not supposed to instill sadness in our hearts but rather a longing for the expectation of Easter and new life. The music will be more contemplative and mellower, as the music during Lent should also instill a longing and penance within us to be consistent with the tradition of the Church.

But for this weekend, let us sing our alleluias loudly! I placed "Alleluia! Sing to Jesus" with verses split between the opening and closing hymn this weekend so that we can sing that word ever more joyfully, while praising and thanking God for his many blessings: his healing ministry, his sacrifice, and the Eucharistic feast we come to the altar to partake of together. As our second reading and communion hymn exclaim this weekend, no matter who we are, we are to do everything for God's glory. Paul told the Corinthians whether they were talking to Jews or Greeks or whomever, to always do what pleases God. Give God glory, sing alleluia, and as we enter Lent this Wednesday, let his grace and forgiveness enter ourselves as we prepare our hearts for Easter.

From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the <u>Catechism of the Catholic</u> <u>Church:</u>

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

- 1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
- 2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
- 3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
- 4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
- 5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
- 6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.
