

#### <u>Craig's corner</u> A Note from our Director of Music

The Church gives us a foretaste of Jesus' Resurrection in the Lenten season this weekend in the Gospel account of the Transfiguration: Jesus changes briefly in appearance before a few of his disciples. But Jesus tells them not to speak of this event again until he is raised from the dead. Of course, we know how the Gospel ends, but imagine being one of the disciples at this time! The evangelist Mark comments on this at the end of the Gospel from this weekend as he remarks that the disciples were very confused as to what rising from the dead actually meant.

Our music this weekend has a twofold purpose: to hold us in the strict disciplines of Lent but also to offer a brief glimpse of this glory the disciples saw. Our opening hymn, "From Ashes to the Living Font," describes the Lenten journey for us, beginning on Ash Wednesday and preparing us for the font of new life at Easter. The hymn continues by praying that we ourselves can become transfigured to new heights as we renew our hearts and minds this season; we, as a Church, desire to journey still through cross and tomb to Easter joy and spirit, fire fulfilled, so that we can be prepared to complete the story of our salvation through Pentecost when we are filled with the Spirit to go forth and proclaim Jesus' name in our world today. Our offertory hymn, "God's Holy Mountain We Ascend," reminds us of the significance of the mountain in the Gospel. Not only did Jesus transfigure himself on a mountain, but he also proclaimed many teachings from the mountaintop. For example, it was on a mountain that he multiplied the loaves and fishes, and so we come to recall the festive meal of the Eucharist as well as we ascend to God's holy mountain every time we come to Mass. At communion, we sing our prayer to take this Lenten season ever more serious, asking God to draw near to us as we are guilty of sin, so that we can furthermore be ready to see not just a glimpse of glory, but the full glory of the resurrection on Easter.

This weekend's postlude, Samuel Barber's *Adagio for Strings* is a common orchestral piece which was transcribed for the organ as well. The piece has been used for many national funerals, including JFK, and was played at a concert to honor the victims of the 9/11 attacks in 2001. The piece has a very calming melody, which is repeated and developed through the work, and ascends to the climax with a brief glimpse of glory before diminishing to almost nothing. The final statement of the original melody concludes the piece.

We cannot experience the full joy of Easter without first experiencing the pain of the cross as well. We only get a glimpse of the Resurrection this weekend, and still have a lot of time in this Lenten season to prepare ourselves in penance and charity to celebrate Easter.

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the **Catechism of the Catholic Church**:

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

- 1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
- 2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
- 3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
- 4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
- 5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
- 6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.


