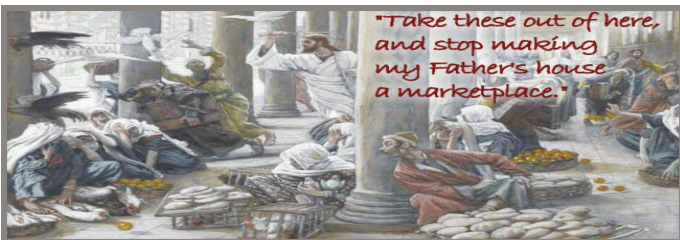

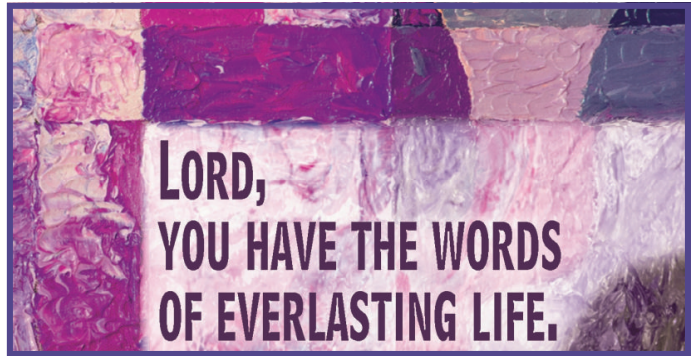

Cold and Flu Season Reminder

During the cold and flu season please remember the following helpful and healthy reminders while at Mass:

- General Considerations:
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or cough/sneeze into your elbow.
- Wash your hands with soap and water frequently. Alcohol based hand cleaners are also effective.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Sign of Peace:
- Do not be offended if someone chooses not to shake your hand at the sign of peace. If you are ill (and present at Mass, the appropriate response to someone extending a sign of peace might be to bow to them and say, "Peace be with you," to avoid contact while sick.
- Reception of Holy Communion:
- While it is the teaching of the Church that the fullness of the Body and Blood of Christ is contained in the Holy Eucharist under the form of the host that is distributed at Mass, the Church has also extended the privilege to receive Holy Communion under the form of wine. However, if you are feeling ill, please consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand and refrain from receiving the Precious Blood until you are returned to good health.

Craig's corner

A Note from our Director of Music

Trust: it's a word that we hear regularly, and we develop it as we grow in relationships with friends, coworkers and family. Our opening psalm this weekend, Psalm 91, invokes God to be with us in time of trouble for He is the God in whom we trust; He will watch over us and never forsake us. Our Responsorial Psalm reminds us that the words of the Lord are those of everlasting life. As we become closer to God, we should develop even more trust in Him. He is with us in times of trouble, and we should have nothing to fear for He is with us.

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus once again alludes to His coming death. A common subject in musical compositions is death. Music can often convey feelings that words alone cannot. It can be a melody and words together or just a musical motive that sparks an emotion inside of us. A specific genre of music related to death is called an elegy. An elegy is defined as a mournful, melancholic poem, especially a funeral song or lament for the dead. This weekend's postlude is a French elegy (spelled *Élégie*). Jesus foreshadowing his approaching death in the Gospel today will be a continuing theme that we will hear in subsequent Gospels leading up to Holy Week. Let us not only use the music of the Lenten season to bring us to a deeper reverence and prayer, but let it console us and let it spark emotion within us praying that the suffering Christ and His Sorrowful Mother be with us in times of trouble. If we grow in our relationship with Him ever more in this season, we can also grow in our spirituality, knowing that in all of our trials on this Earth, if we trust in God, we know He is there to comfort us.

Our offertory hymn this weekend, "I heard the Voice of Jesus Say," does just that: speaks words of comfort. Jesus tells us to come to Him to find a place of refreshment and peace. The Mass where we celebrate our first scrutiny of RCIA members who are coming into the Church this Easter Vigil hears the Gospel of the woman at the well. This is the basis for the text of the second verse of this hymn: the woman came to the well for a drink and Jesus told her to trust in Him; He is the living water from which all good things come.

Whether we hear the readings of the Year A or B cycle this weekend, depending on which Mass we are attending, we should feel comforted by Jesus' words. Yes, he will die for our sins and thus this season of repentance is upon us. But, when we are brought to new life in the Easter mystery, and are brought from the Cross to the Resurrection, let us trust in Him always to be our stronghold, our rock of salvation: the God in whom we **trust**.

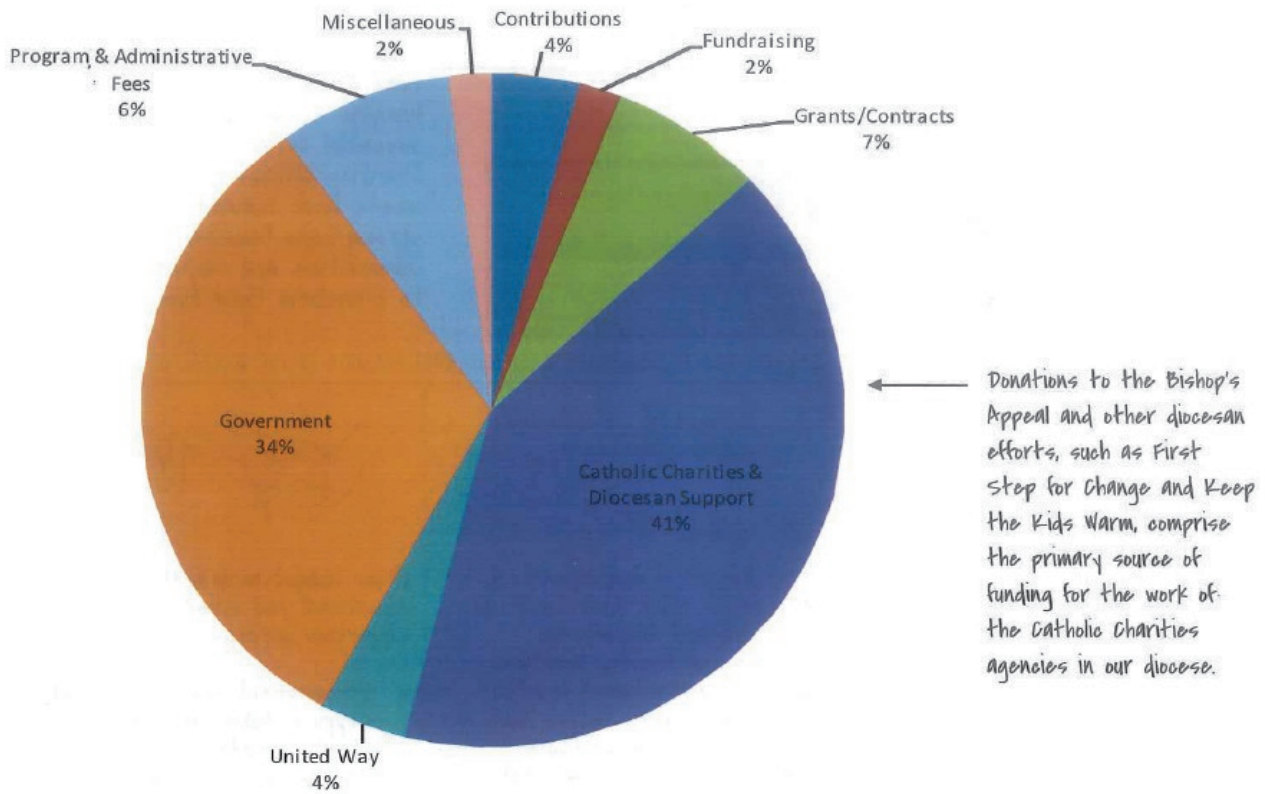
