Who Was Padre Pio?

The Saint Pio Foundation, which is sponsoring the tour on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of his passing, will sell books and items related to padre Pio in the entryway of the cathedral. St. Pio was born on Mary 25, 1887 in Pietrelcina, Italy, and baptized Francesco Forgione. He first expressed his desire for priesthood at age 10. In order to pay for preparatory education, his father Grazio Forgione, emigrated to the United States in 1889 and he worked here for several years. The future saint entered the Capuchin order at age 15, talking the name Pio. He was ordained a priest in 1910 at the age of 23. During his lifetime, Padre Pio was known as a mystic with miraculous powers of healing and knowledge, who bore the stigmata for fifty years. Stigmata is the term the Catholic Church used to speak about the wounds an individual receives that correspond to the crucifixion wounds of Jesus Christ. They can appear on the forehead, hands, wrists and feet. Padre Pio's stigmata emerged during World War I, after Pope Benedict XV asked Christians to pray for an end to the conflict. Padre Pio had a vision in which Christ pierced his side. A few weeks later, on Sept. 20, 1918. Jesus again appeared to him, and he received the full stigmata. It remained with him until his death on Sept. 23, 1968. Pope John Paul II canonized him St. Pio of Pietrelcina in 2002. This year marks the 50th anniversary of St. Pio's death.

SENIOR CITIZEN MEETING, WEDNESDAY, MARCH 14TH AFTER THE 12 NOON MASS! BRING A FRIEND!



This weekend our RCIA class again celebrates a scrutiny, so our 5PM Mass contains the cycle A readings; the other three Masses hear the B cycle readings. Regardless of which cycle we hear proclaimed at Mass, the theme of light is strong. In the A readings, St. Paul tells us to live as children of the light, not darkness, and we hear the Gospel of Jesus restoring the gift of sight to the blind man so that he can see the light of Christ shine in front of him. In the B readings, Jesus tells Nicodemus that He has come into the world to die for the world because the world is in darkness and sin, in need of light. Therefore, our offertory hymn, "I want to walk as a Child of the Light" proclaims these common themes, reminding us that if we follow the way of Christ, we are not in darkness, for in Him the night and the day are both alike.

It is no coincidence that the Church places this theme of light on the fourth Sunday of our Lenten journey. This weekend, our basilica blossoms in rose color as we celebrate our joy, in Latin, *Laetare*. Our opening hymn reminds us that while these forty days of Lent are days of fasting, they are still forty glorious days. We recall that on this weekend, we can joyfully celebrate that this season of repentance is past its halfway point, and the time to celebrate the saving acts of Jesus are approaching.

This weekend's postlude is an organ chorale written off of the text of the psalm from the cycle B readings this weekend. The psalm prays that our tongues will be silent if we forget the name of the Lord. Without the Lord, we are in darkness. Pope Francis wrote the following in his encyclical *Lumen Fidei (The Light of Faith)*: "There is an urgent need, then, to see once again that faith is a light, for once the flame of faith dies out, all other lights begin to dim. The light of faith is unique, since it is capable of illuminating every aspect of human existence. A light this powerful cannot come from ourselves but from a more primordial source: in a word, it must come from God."

This season of Lent is about strengthening our faith by pushing away from sinfulness and darkness with our eyes aimed at the light of Christ. As we come closer to the celebration of Jesus' acts of salvation, may we remember that our faith in Christ is what lightens this world; in Him there is no darkness. Let us pray that we continue to move away from darkness in the glory of these forty days in order to, in the words of our offertory hymn, allow the light of the Lord Jesus shine in our hearts.



of our budget is dedicated to homeless outreach and case management services, homeless prevention, housing counseling, permanent housing, and other services to keep individuals and families in their homes.




