

# **THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER**



The Church has always held the pipe organ in high esteem for its celebration of Mass. In the Church documents on music and Liturgy, The General Instruction of the Roman Missal and Sing to the Lord, it is stated, "Among all other instruments which are suitable for divine worship, the organ is accorded pride of place because of its capacity to sustain the singing of a large gathered assembly, due to both its size and its ability to give resonance to the fullness of human sentiments, from joy to sadness, from praise to lamentation. Likewise, the manifold possibilities of the organ in some way remind us of the immensity and the magnificence of God." The many sounds of the organ allow it to lead the congregation, and I have previously discussed the different sounds that our basilica organ has. The organ has sounds such as calm flutes and strings. Our psalm this weekend acclaims that through the Resurrection, the Lord has let his light shine upon us and that we can fall peacefully asleep at night knowing the Lord brings us security through the saving acts of redemption. This weekend's prelude, "Berceuse" (Lullaby), echoes this sentiment. However, while the organ can be peaceful, it can also be exclamatory. One way for it to be like this is with sounds such as the trumpet stop, which would be called a reed in the organ class. Many large church organs contain multiple different types of "reed" sounds. Organ reeds produce sound similar to a saxophone, as air vibrates against a brass tube (called a shallot) producing the sound, just like a saxophone player's breath makes the reed vibrate against the saxophone mouthpiece to produce sound. The organ reed sounds can be sounds such as a clarinet, oboe, and trumpet. On our small basilica organ, we only have one reed sound, the trumpet. What better season is there to use the trumpet stop on the organ than Easter? This weekend's postlude, "The Emperor's Fanfare," was written specifically for reed stops on the organ on which it is being played. As we continue our Easter journey, our readings continue to focus on the resurrection and our hymns continue to acclaim the joy begun on Easter day. We also take the opportunity this weekend to replace the Penitential Act with the Rite of Sprinkling to remind us of the baptismal promises we renewed on Easter Sunday. May our voices continue to sing out in joy as we hear the organ trumpets praise our risen King!



# From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church:</u> An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

- 1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
- 2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
- 3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
- 4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
- 5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
- 6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.


The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.


