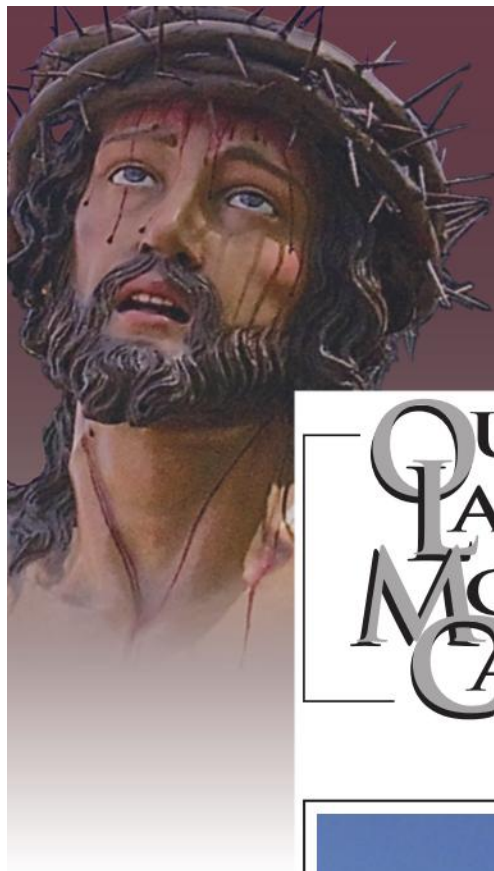

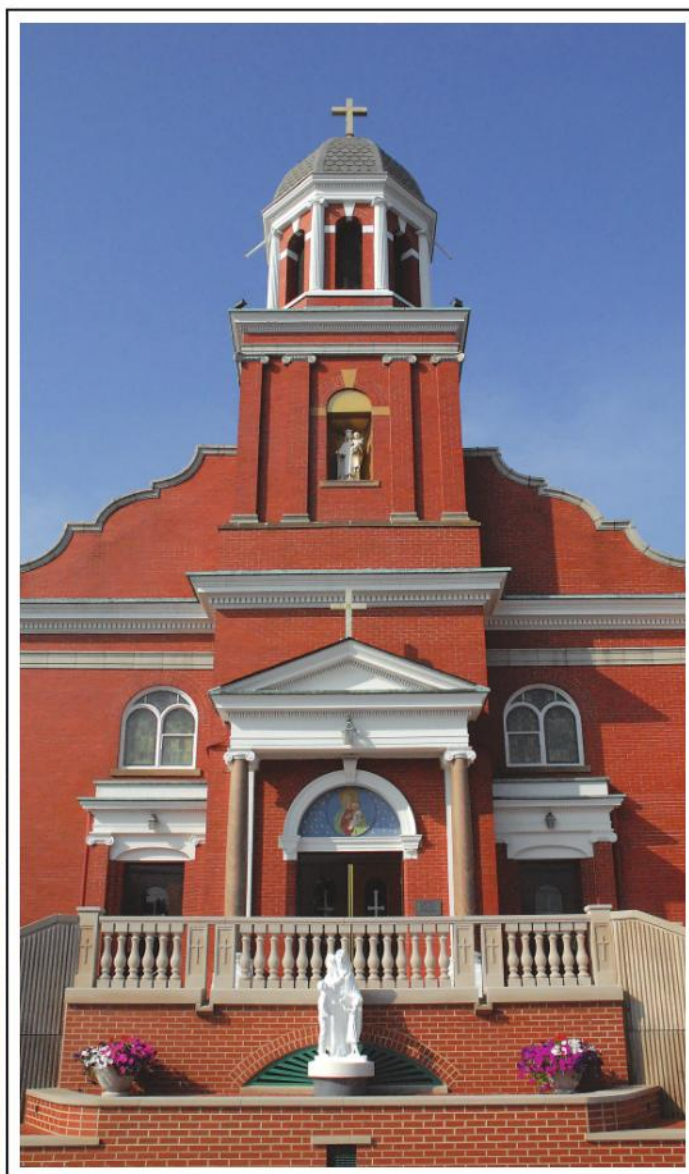

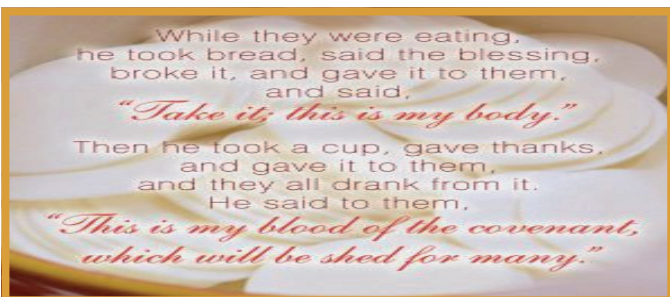

Craig's Corner

A Note from our Director of Music

This Sunday's Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is celebrated each year after Trinity Sunday. It parallels our celebration of Holy Thursday, but since Holy Week is often overshadowed by the Passion of the Lord, early Church leaders wanted another day to also celebrate the Lord's institution of the Eucharist to call extra attention to the mystery at the altar which we celebrate each Mass. After the noon Mass this weekend, we mirror the transfer of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday with our procession of the Eucharist with benediction. Our music also mirrors the Holy Thursday celebration this weekend. The hymn *At That First Eucharist*, which celebrates the institution of the Eucharist, is sung again as offertory hymn, and is the subject for the weekend's prelude. This prelude also echoes hints of the melody *Adoro te Devote (Humbly We Adore Thee)*, also referencing the institution of the Eucharist. Our opening hymn *Praise to The Lord* reminds us that we bring these gifts of bread and wine to the altar, to become the Body and Blood of Christ: Jesus used ordinary, earthly things – bread and wine – to become His body and blood! The postlude processional at all of the Masses except the Noon Mass where our Eucharistic procession takes place, is based on this hymn with its direct statement of the hymn in whole notes brings this Solemnity to a much more joyous conclusion than in silence like we do on Holy Thursday!

While we always take time to meditate on the importance of the Eucharist when we celebrate it each Mass, hopefully the joyous setting placed before us this weekend, where we are not overshadowed by Holy Week, we can especially focus on a central aspect of our faith.

From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the **Catechism of the Catholic Church**: An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.

The saints bring us closer to Jesus. Do not be afraid to call upon Saint Anthony of Padua who is among the Communion of Saints in Heaven very close to God.

~How To Venerate~

The Franciscans encourage people to TOUCH the reliquaries. One may touch the reliquary with their hand, any religious object such as rosary beads, prayer cards, Bibles, and prayer books as well as photos of ill family members. We allow photography because the Franciscans think it is a beautiful thing to share the experience through photos with a loved one who is not able to attend. We also see people finding a loved one on their cell among their photos and then touching the reliquary with the cell phone ever so gently. Our relics are first class relics of the saint - actually body parts. One reliquary contains a fragment of the saint's floating rib and the other contains skin layers of the saint's cheek. 2nd class relics are an object that a saint might have possessed in her or his lifetime – their habit or a prayer book. As for a third-class relic, we pass out holy cards inside the prayer petition envelope. The prayer is a beautiful prayer to the miraculous saint which you may recite when you drop your prayer petition in the basket next to the reliquary and while venerating the reliquary. Any religious objects that you touch the reliquary with will become a third-class relic of the saint. We Catholics know that only God performs miracles. We call upon the communion of saints to intercede on our behalf to lift our prayers and petitions to God in Heaven.

A quote from Pope Benedict Emeritus

In an address in Cologne, Germany, Thursday, August 18, 2005, Pope Benedict Emeritus said of relics “By inviting us to venerate the mortal remains of the martyrs and saints, the Church does not forget that, in the end, these are indeed just human bones, but they are bones that belonged to individuals touched by the living power of God. The relics of the saints are traces of that invisible but real presence which sheds light upon the shadows of the world and reveals the Kingdom of Heaven in our midst.”
