





Craig's Corner

A Note from our Director of Music

This weekend's focus in our readings is *bread*. In the first reading, we hear of the Old Testament account of the Israelites complaining to Moses because of the lack of food in the desert. To show that He is the Lord, He fills them with bread. This account is echoed in the Gospel when Jesus tells the crowd that He has come to become our living bread. Jesus recounts that it was not Moses that gave the Israelites the bread in the first reading, but rather, God. Thus, as the Responsorial Psalm reminds us too this weekend, it is the Lord that gives us bread from heaven. Jesus takes this a step farther by reminding us that now in the New Testament, He is the living bread which has come down from heaven – literally – to become the Eucharist we celebrate each time we come to Mass.

We as Christians are called to be bread to others, in a sense, to be in service to others, just as Christ came to serve. The hymn "We Are Your People" used in part at both the opening and closing of Mass this weekend states this call of our faith perfectly. We are called from many lands, rooted in our faith, and nourished by the word of Christ.

A direct statement of the closing of the gospel this weekend is heard in our offertory hymn this weekend, "I Am the Bread of Life." Our communion hymn, "I Received the Living God," also contains the direct statement of Jesus telling us He is the bread which comes from heaven. This hymn also quotes Jesus saying that He is the Truth. Paul speaks of this truth in the second reading as he tells us to become a new self. This new self is us being bread to others. Jesus came to fulfill the Old Testament, and this weekend we see this unfold before our eyes from the two accounts from the Old and New Testaments: the bread given to the Israelites in the desert and Jesus coming on earth to give us himself as bread.

One function of the Mass' prelude music is to prefigure what is to come at Mass. The hymn "Humbly We Adore Thee" which we often sing on Holy Thursday, when we celebrate the institution of the Eucharist, contains a verse speaking of Christ as our bread, in which we thank Him for feeding us with that bread which sustains us for eternal life. An arrangement of this hymn is used as the prelude this weekend. Let us as we go through this week focus on being bread to others, as "We Are Your People" concludes, Christ is our bread, feeding us and strengthening us in our Christian call.

From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church:</u> An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

- 1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
- 2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
- 3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
- 4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
- 5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
- 6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.
