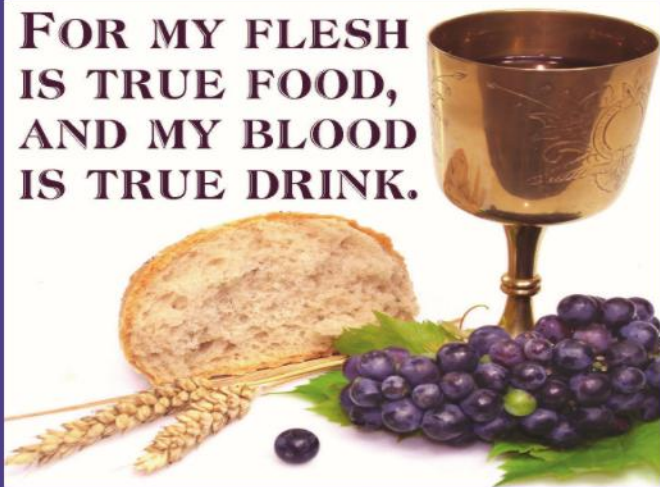

Craig's Corner

A Note from our Director of Music

“God has bestowed upon his people the gift of song. God dwells within each human person, in the place where music takes its source. Indeed, God, the giver of song, is present whenever his people sing his praises.”

This line, which comes from the opening of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops’ document on the role of music in Liturgy, *Sing to the Lord*, states how important using our gift of music, no matter how big or small it may be, to sing God’s praises. We are given many opportunities in our Catholic Mass in which we can use the gift of song to praise God. We have hymns, antiphons, psalms, and the Ordinary of the Mass which we may sing. But what is the difference between these elements of our Mass?

A **hymn** is a song of praise that does not necessarily come directly from scripture. Often times the text in the hymns we sing are inspired by scriptures, but they aren’t necessarily direct quotations. Many strictly Catholic hymns are adaptations of texts from ancient Gregorian chant texts, while other hymns can be strophic texts praising God or praying specific aspects of Christianity. **Antiphons** are refrains of text which are direct quotations of scripture or psalm. They are found as part of the Mass for the opening or communion rites, but a hymn of equal character of the theme of the season is appropriate.

Psalms are of course, taken from the Book of Psalms and are always used after the first reading, but can also be used as the text of an antiphon. The parts that make up the **Ordinary** are those which are common to each celebration and season and do not vary from week to week, or from season to season. These include the Gloria, Creed (yes, in ancient Roman liturgy this was often sung instead of recited like we are more accustomed to now), Sanctus, and Agnus Dei.

Our theme of recent weeks continues this weekend. As we sing of our Eucharistic Lord, coming to the altar to partake of the living bread, let us always enjoy the gift of song we have in Mass, no matter what form it may be in: hymn, antiphon, psalm, or Ordinary. We praise our God, the giver of song, who is present as we sing His praise.

From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the **Catechism of the Catholic Church**: An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord’s prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.
