The root word, "catechesis," is from a Greek word meaning "to echo, or resound." Catechesis is the act of resounding or bringing the Church's teachings to the world. A catechist is one who teaches in the name of the Church.

A Note from our Director of Music

A few weeks ago, Father Larry Richards from Living Bread Radio came here to talk about the answer to the question: "How do we get to heaven?" Monsignor Cariglio brought up a few of the points Fr. Richards made in the talk in his homily the Sunday following, recalling that one of the key points was fulfilling the commandment of true love. This weekend's scriptures open before us a similar picture as St. James talks about how jealousy and selfish ambition do not lead to good works; rather, wisdom from above and the fruits of righteousness are what cultivate peace. Jesus echoes the sentiments of peace in the Gospel this weekend as He peacefully places a child in the midst of the disciples, who are arguing about earthly things like which one of them is the greatest.

Christ calls us this weekend to be at peace with one another instead of fight over earthly things, which are the source of selfish ambition and foul practice according to St. James. Our offertory hymn, "I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light," reminds us that if we come to Jesus, we find no distinction between night and day. If we follow Jesus, instead of being concerned regarding the things of earth, we are at peace. One of the most familiar prayers of peace come from St. Francis of Assisi and his text which we sing at Communion this weekend. "The Prayer of St. Francis" also reminds us to focus on Christ and in hatred, be loving; in sadness, find joy; and in darkness, be light. Jesus tells us that if we receive His children like He does, then we will also receive Him.

Let us crown Him Lord of all as our opening hymn states this weekend. In doing this, we shall be at peace. Our music and readings this weekend focus on Christ as the center of our faith; in the week ahead, let us live this out in our workplaces and community, leaving selfishness and jealousy aside.

From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u>:

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

- 1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
- 2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
- 3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
- 4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
- 5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
- 6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.


