A Note from our Director of Music

This weekend we are called by Christ to be of service to one another. When we think we might not be able to offer this service, we look to today's Gospel as even Jesus' disciples fall to the thinking of this world. They ask Jesus if they can be on His right and left side in the kingdom. They are thinking as humans do, not as God does. He tells them that if you want to be great, you must be last. We must be servants – Christ came to serve, and we must live in His shadow, not as the rest of the world lives.

Our opening hymn states, "Though the eye made blind by sin, Thy glory may not see." How true this is! If we look to the things of this world instead of our service to God and neighbor, we may not see God's glory. Our sin blinds us from God. Instead we must look to that which is holy; thus, we will be on our way to serving God and our neighbors. Our Eucharistic feast that we come to each time we attend Mass is God's gift to us to be one with Him while we are on our earthly journey. Our offertory and communion hymns dwell on this aspect of our faith this weekend. The first and second readings this weekend remind us of Christ's suffering and that Christ was without sin, and this is why we want to do our best to model him: not thinking as humans do, but as God does.

As part of our Masses, instrumental music is played as prelude to the Mass, during offertory, or as a postlude following the final blessing or final hymn (if there is one). Often times, I select a particular piece of music from the Classical genre called a fugue. The music dictionary defines a fugue as "a contrapuntal composition in which a short melody or phrase, called the subject, is introduced by one part and successively taken by others and developed by interweaving the parts."

To dissect this briefly for organ fugues, a melody is usually played as a solo line without any accompaniment; upon its completion, it then switches to another voice. For example, this weekend's fugue from Bach's famous *Toccata and Fugue in D Minor* begins in the tenor voice; after a full statement of the subject, the left hand takes over as accompaniment and the top voice, the soprano voice, takes over the melody. Throughout the six minutes of the fugue, the melody is adapted slightly at times, hidden at times, and directly stated at times in different voices. Sometimes fugue melodies are melodies that we know, such as last week's St. Anne fugue; it was a fragment of the opening hymn.
