Craig's Corner

A Note from our Director of Music

Last weekend, I quoted a line from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' directive about silence during our Masses. Because of its importance, I wanted to again quote this fragment of the document.

"Music arises out of silence and returns to silence. God is revealed both in the beauty of song and in the power of silence. The Sacred Liturgy has its rhythm of texts, actions, songs, and silence. Silence in the Liturgy allows the community to reflect on what it has heard and experienced, and to open its heart to the mystery celebrated. Ministers and pastoral musicians should take care that the rites unfold with the proper ebb and flow of sound and silence. The importance of silence in the Liturgy cannot be overemphasized."

This weekend as our basilica welcomes the major relics of St. Padre Pio, our prelude and postlude are more contemplative so that those coming into and out of the basilica before and after Mass can offer prayers through his intercession. Padre Pio's prayer is used as our communion hymn this weekend, asking God to be with us always. Our Gospel message of obeying God's commandments of love also bring us closer to God in our Masses and in our private prayer life. Let us allow the silences in Mass, the honor of seeing the major relics of St. Padre Pio this weekend, and our following of the commandments of love to bring us to a stronger faith.

From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the **Catechism of the Catholic Church**: An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.

Cold and Flu Season Reminder

During the cold and flu season please remember the following helpful and healthy reminders while at Mass:

General Considerations:

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or cough/sneeze into your elbow.

Wash your hands with soap and water frequently. Alcohol based hand cleaners are also effective.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Sign of Peace:

Do not be offended if someone chooses not to shake your hand at the sign of peace. If you are ill (and present at Mass, the appropriate response to someone extending a sign of peace might be to bow to them and say, "Peace be with you," to avoid contact while sick.

Reception of Holy Communion:

While it is the teaching of the Church that the fullness of the Body and Blood of Christ is contained in the Holy Eucharist under the form of the host that is distributed at Mass, the Church has also extended the privilege to receive Holy Communion under the form of wine. However, if you are feeling ill, please consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand and refrain from receiving the Precious Blood until you are returned to good health.
