





A Note from our Director of Music

"The Gloria is a very ancient and venerable hymn in which the Church, gathered together in the Holy Spirit, glorifies and entreats God the Father and the Lamb. The text of this hymn be replaced by any other text....It is sung or said on Sundays outside the Seasons of Advent and Lent, on solemnities and feasts, and at special celebrations of a more solemn character.' The priest, or the cantor or choir, intones the Gloria. It is sung by all, by the people alternately with the choir or cantor, or by the choir alone. 'The addition of refrains to the Glory to God is permitted, provided the refrains encourage congregational participation.' While through-composed settings of the Gloria give clearest expression to the text. The Gloria may not be moved to a different part of the Mass than the one assigned by the *Roman Missal*. It may not, for example, be used in place of the Entrance chant or song, or during the sprinkling with blessed water."

The Church, in its directives in both *Sing to the Lord,* and *The General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, state clearly the importance of singing the Gloria at Mass as stated above. In this month of November, as we conclude the Liturgical Year, we return as a basilica parish, to the "Melodic Gloria" which is the one Gloria in our music repertoire at the parish which has the refrain (aside from the Christmas Gloria) and is not entirely throughcomposed like the Latin, English Chant or Mass of Redemption Gloria.

In our psalm this weekend, we are reminded that God is good and worthy of praise. The Gloria is a festive hymn of praise and thus is why it is such an important staple in our Masses. Our hymns this weekend also focus on the praise which only God is worthy of. In the Gospel we hear the account of the woman who gave all she had for the temple. We too, are called to follow Christ and give Him our whole livelihood. This is summed up in our offertory hymn where we seek to think and do as God does. We ask for the intercession of the Spirit to breathe in us God's breath.

As we praise God this weekend and every time we come to Mass, let us sing for joy as we give Him all we have.

From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church:</u> An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

- 1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
- 2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
- 3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
- 4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
- 5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
- 6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Cold and Flu Season Reminder

During the cold and flu season please remember the following helpful and healthy reminders while at Mass:

General Considerations:

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or cough/sneeze into your elbow.

Wash your hands with soap and water frequently. Alcohol based hand cleaners are also effective.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Sign of Peace:

Do not be offended if someone chooses not to shake your hand at the sign of peace. If you are ill (and present at Mass, the appropriate response to someone extending a sign of peace might be to bow to them and say, "Peace be with you," to avoid contact while sick.

Reception of Holy Communion:

While it is the teaching of the Church that the fullness of the Body and Blood of Christ is contained in the Holy Eucharist under the form of the host that is distributed at Mass, the Church has also extended the privilege to receive Holy Communion under the form of wine. However, if you are feeling ill, please consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand and refrain from receiving the Precious Blood until you are returned to good health.


