

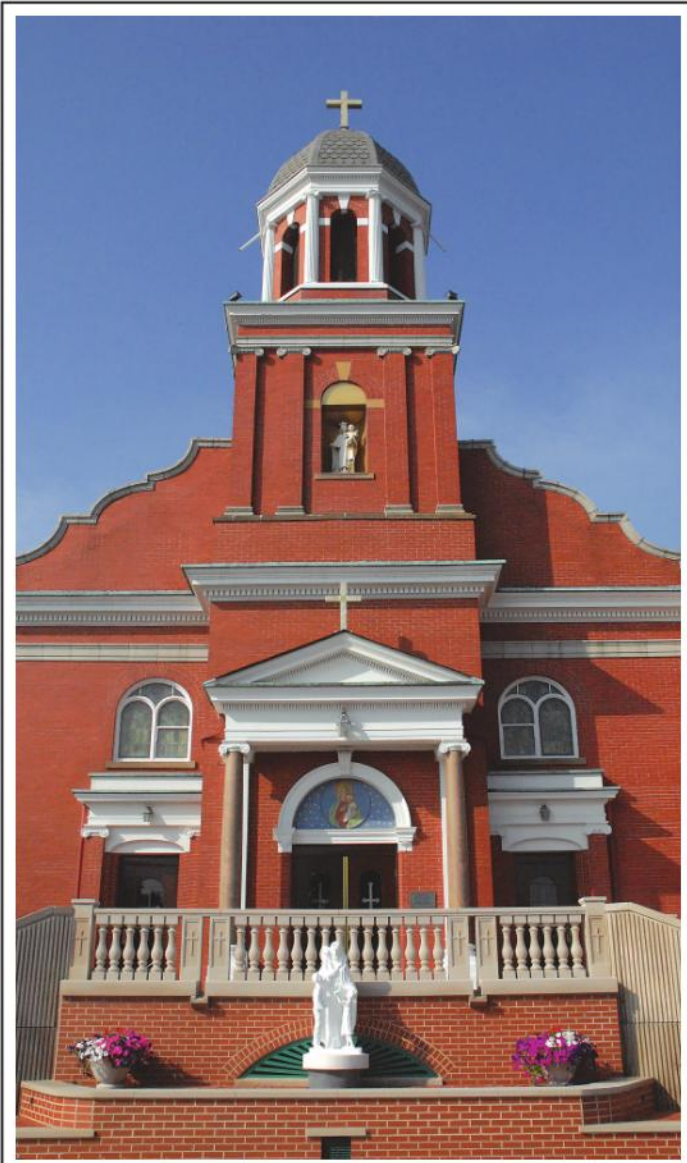

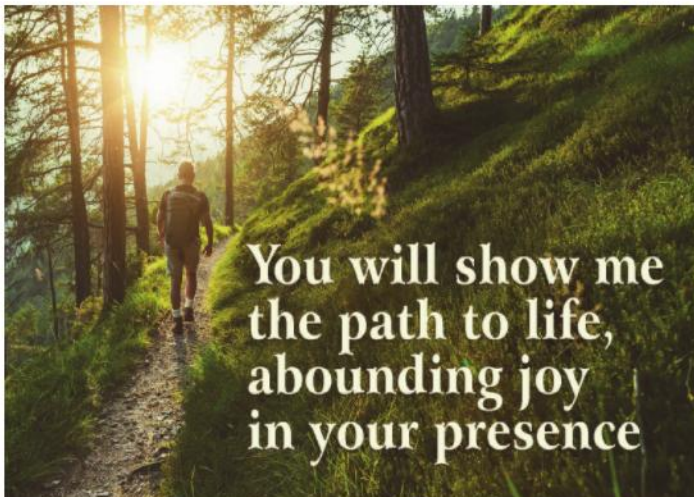

Craig's Corner

A Note from our Director of Music

I often stress the importance of Psalms in our Masses. These are texts even Jesus himself prayed with the disciples. The Church documents on music state the following about the Psalms:

“The Responsorial Psalm in the Liturgy of the Word of the Mass and of other rites ‘holds great liturgical and pastoral importance, because it fosters meditation on the word of God.’ The Entrance and Communion chants with their psalm verses serve to accompany the two most important processions of the Mass: the entrance procession, by which the Mass begins, and the Communion procession, by which the faithful approach the altar to receive Holy Communion. Participation in song on the part of the assembly is commended during both of these important processions, as the People of God gather at the beginning of Mass and as the faithful approach the holy altar to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord.”

As these directives state, the opening procession being accompanied by a Psalm should be the first option, or a suitable hymn. This weekend, a common Psalm for the end of Ordinary Time is used for the opening procession, Psalm 122. The text of the Psalm refers to a new Jerusalem. Our readings at this juncture of the Liturgical Year, as noted this weekend, turn our attention to the end times which this world will cease. It is at this point where our eyes must be fixed on the eternal Jerusalem prepared for us.

This weekend, as we prepare to gather with our families to celebrate Thanksgiving, we give our thanks to God and the Mother of Christ, Mary, for their many blessings in this world. But we are reminded that this world is not permanent. It will pass away, the sun will be darkened and the heavens shaken. We pray that we look to the new Jerusalem and await the second coming of Christ which we will also celebrate as we prepare to begin Advent in a couple weeks.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION
Cold and Flu Season Reminder

During the cold and flu season please remember the following helpful and healthy reminders while at Mass:

General Considerations:

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or cough/sneeze into your elbow.

Wash your hands with soap and water frequently. Alcohol based hand cleaners are also effective.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Sign of Peace:

Do not be offended if someone chooses not to shake your hand at the sign of peace. If you are ill (and present at Mass, the appropriate response to someone extending a sign of peace might be to bow to them and say, “Peace be with you,” to avoid contact while sick.

Reception of Holy Communion:

While it is the teaching of the Church that the fullness of the Body and Blood of Christ is contained in the Holy Eucharist under the form of the host that is distributed at Mass, the Church has also extended the privilege to receive Holy Communion under the form of wine. However, if you are feeling ill, please consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand and refrain from receiving the Precious Blood until you are returned to good health.

SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

Celebrated on the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Solemnity of Christ the King was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas* to respond to growing secularism. He recognized that attempting to “thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law” out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations.

In 2018, the Church faces pressures from without and crisis from within. In addition to the challenges that Christians in a secular society must confront, the body of Christ must also tend to the wounds inflicted on the Church by priests and bishops who either committed acts of sexual abuse themselves or failed to respond to abuse with justice when they had the opportunity. The Solemnity reminds the faithful that Christ reigns as king of the entire world forever. Let us rededicate ourselves this year to recognizing the reign of Jesus Christ and his Sacred Heart in every aspect of our lives.

We profess with our whole lives that Jesus is Lord.

“If to Christ our Lord is given all power in heaven and on earth; if all men, purchased by his precious blood, are by a new right subjected to his dominion; if this power embraces all men, it must be clear that not one of our faculties is exempt from his empire. He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all

things, and cleave to him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls, or to use the words of the Apostle Paul, ‘as instruments of justice unto God.’
—*Quas primas*, 33



We recognize the reign of Christ in public life, as well as private life.

“The whole Church must work vigorously in order that men may become capable of rectifying the distortion of the temporal order and directing it to God through Christ. Pastors must clearly state the principles concerning the purpose of creation and the use of temporal things and must offer the moral and spiritual aids by which the temporal order may be renewed in Christ. The laity must take up the renewal of the temporal order as their own special obligation. [...] Everywhere and in all things they must seek the justice of God’s kingdom. The temporal order must be renewed in such a way that, without detriment to its own proper laws, it may be brought into conformity with the higher principles of the Christian life and adapted to the shifting circumstances of time, place, and peoples.” —*Apostolicam actuositatem*, 7
