



<u> HÓST:</u>

1 cup lukewarm water

1 cup flour

1 tsp + few drops of oil

Dash of Salt

Beat mixture for 5 minutes. Let stand 5 hours, stirring every half hour. (This recipe is for use with an Ostia maker and if none is available, you may purchase the Ostia at the rectory).

FILLING:

1 Bag of Hershey Kisses or 1 large Hershey Bar 1/2-3/4 lb. skinned almonds

1 pint of honey

OPTIONAL:

Orange extract, grated orange rind or vanilla. Melt chocolate in double boiler or microwave. Add honey at the same time. When all is melted, add chopped almonds and flavoring. Remove from heat and fill host.

Craig's Corner

A Note from our Director of Music

Merriam Webster defines the word *silence* as "forbearance of speech and noise: absence of sound or noise." A synonym for this word is stillness. In our Communion antiphon last weekend for the First Sunday of Advent we sang, "For you, O Lord, my soul in stillness waits." This stillness and silence is a major component to the Advent season. Understand, though, that silence doesn't mean sadness; we are to treat this season with joy! In lieu of preludes this season, a short setting of the entrance antiphon done as an introit will be sung in the minutes leading up to Mass.

In the secular world, the weeks leading up to Christmas are always busy and hectic – anything but silent and still. The Church in its rich history and Tradition gives us these four weeks (this year just barely four weeks since Christmas falls on a Tuesday) to separate ourselves from this hustle and bustle but rather, silently contemplate the coming of Christ. Our offertory hymn this weekend, "O Come, Divine Messiah," also dwells on this facet of the season: "the world in silence waits the day, when hope shall sing its triumph, and sadness flee away." John the Baptist, from whom we hear in the Gospel this weekend and in our hymns, is an important figure to keep in our minds this season. Connecting this theme, this weekend's postlude is a setting of a German Advent chorale proclaiming of the coming of Christ, "Savior of the Nations. Come."

Before and during Mass, especially during this Advent season, let us take advantage of these periods of silence so that we can prepare for the coming of Christ with the absence of the sounds and noise of the secular season we are bombarded with in the secular world.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION **Cold and Flu Season Reminder**

During the cold and flu season please remember the following helpful and healthy reminders while at Mass:

General Considerations:

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or cough/sneeze into your elbow.

Wash your hands with soap and water frequently. Alcohol based hand cleaners are also effective.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Sign of Peace:

Do not be offended if someone chooses not to shake your hand at the sign of peace. If you are ill (and present at Mass, the appropriate response to someone extending a sign of peace might be to bow to them and say, "Peace be with you," to avoid contact while sick. Reception of Holy Communion:

While it is the teaching of the Church that the fullness of the Body and Blood of Christ is contained in the Holy Eucharist under the form of the host that is distributed at Mass, the Church has also extended the privilege to receive Holy Communion under the form of wine. However, if you are feeling ill, please consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand and refrain from receiving the Precious Blood until you are returned to good health.


