A Note from our Director of Music

Our Christmas season continues this weekend as we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. I often find humor in the reaction I get from some of my friends who are not as well versed in the Liturgical Year when they hear that I'm still playing Christmas music for a few weeks after actual Christmas day. I also always find it interesting that the radio stations that start Christmas music what seems like months ahead of Christmas, go back to their regular brand as soon as the clock strikes midnight on December 26, they don't even give us through new year's eve or day!

Regardless of what the secular world does, the Church celebrates Christmas day as an octave: eight days of celebrating Christmas day. This feast of the Holy Family falls on the Sunday in the octave of Christmas. The octave concludes with the celebration of Mary as the Mother of God on January 1. But the Christmas season doesn't end there. We still celebrate Epiphany next Sunday and the Baptism of the Lord the following Sunday.

So even though the radio stations don't play the Christmas music any more, let us enjoy our Liturgical celebration of Christmas this weekend and continuing through January 13. We will still be singing Christmas hymns and carols praising our newborn King. The prelude and postlude this weekend are fun arrangements of the common Christmas hymns we use this weekend.

Cold and Flu Season Reminder

During the cold and flu season please remember the following helpful and healthy reminders while at Mass:

General Considerations:

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when vou cough or sneeze or cough/sneeze into vour elbow.

Wash your hands with soap and water frequently. Alcohol based hand cleaners are also effective.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Sign of Peace:

Do not be offended if someone chooses not to shake your hand at the sign of peace. If you are ill (and present at Mass, the appropriate response to someone extending a sign of peace might be to bow to them and say, "Peace be with you," to avoid contact while sick.

Reception of Holy Communion:

While it is the teaching of the Church that the fullness of the Body and Blood of Christ is contained in the Holy Eucharist under the form of the host that is distributed at Mass, the Church has also extended the privilege to receive Holy Communion under the form of wine. However, if you are feeling ill, please consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand and refrain from receiving the Precious Blood until you are returned to good health.

Pray that they keep their hearts and minds open to what God has planned for each and every one of them.


