

From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church:</u> An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

- May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
- 2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
- 3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
- 4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
- December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
- 6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

 The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis.


The Saint Andrew Bible Missal talks about this season,

The every seven-day celebration of the Lord's Day is the basic structure upon which the Church Year is built. The great liturgical seasons of Advent-Christmas and Lent-Easter are more expansive celebrations of particular aspects of the one paschal mystery which we celebrate every Lord's Day. These seasons in no way minimize the critical importance of the Sunday celebration throughout the rest of the year. Ordinary Time is not very ordinary at all. Ordinary Time, is the identifying mark of the Christian community which comes together, remembering that on this first day of the week the Lord of Life was raised up and creation came at last to completion. What happens in our churches every Sunday is the fruit of our week. Sunday, like all sacraments, is simultaneously a point of arrival and departure for Christians on their way to the fullness of the kingdom. This is not ordinary at all. This is the fabric of Christian living.

This weekend, Jesus opens up the Scriptures to us as He continues to reveal Himself to the disciples and those He comes in contact with. As we celebrate these weeks of Ordinary Time ahead of the Lenten season, let us celebrate and sing to Christ, the all immortal to be adored, as He reveals Himself to us just as He did to the disciples two thousand years ago.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION Cold and Flu Season Reminder

During the cold and flu season please remember the following helpful and healthy reminders while at Mass:

General Considerations:

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or cough/sneeze into your elbow.

Wash your hands with soap and water frequently. Alcohol based hand cleaners are also effective.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Sign of Peace:

Do not be offended if someone chooses not to shake your hand at the sign of peace. If you are ill (and present at Mass, the appropriate response to someone extending a sign of peace might be to bow to them and say, "Peace be with you," to avoid contact while sick.

Reception of Holy Communion:

While it is the teaching of the Church that the fullness of the Body and Blood of Christ is contained in the Holy Eucharist under the form of the host that is distributed at Mass, the Church has also extended the privilege to receive Holy Communion under the form of wine. However, if you are feeling ill, please consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand and refrain from receiving the Precious Blood until you are returned to good health.






