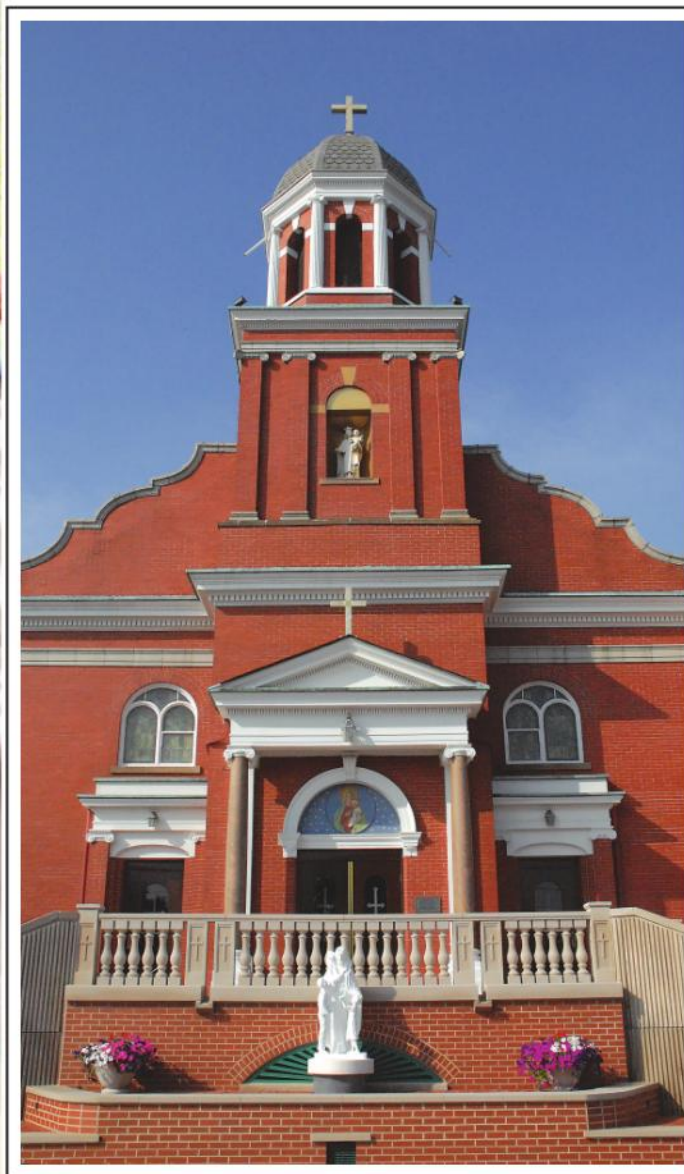

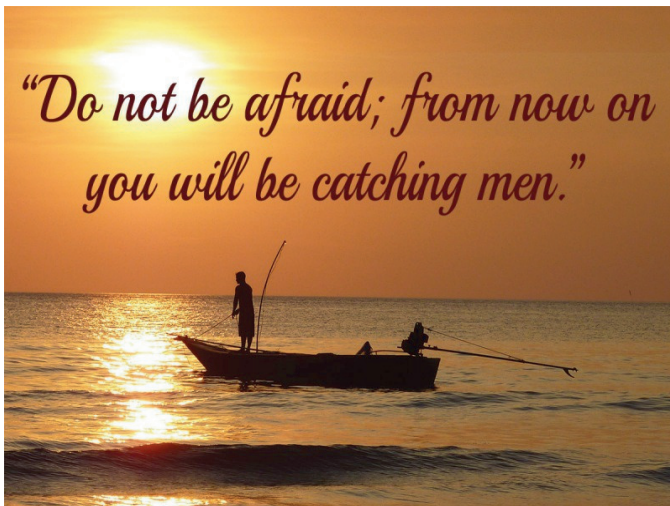

Craig's Corner

A Note from our Director of Music

This weekend's prelude sets the tone of the location of the Gospel, on the bank of the Lake of Gennesaret. Handel's "Water Music Suite" was actually written to be played as entertainment along the water for a cruise that King George I was having in Great Britain in 1717. While the scene in the Gospel isn't quite a relaxing cruise, Jesus does find his first disciples on the bank of the water.

This weekend Jesus calls his first disciples, even though they do not feel worthy. Likewise, in the first reading, the prophet Isaiah sees the seraphim of angels praising the Lord but acclaims that he is doomed because of sin. But the seraphim tell him that because of the Lord of hosts, wickedness is destroyed and with Isaiah renewed, the reading concludes by the Lord calling him. This is exactly what our opening and communion hymns speak of this weekend. Like the prelude, our communion hymn, "Lord, when you Came to the Seashore," paints the image of the water to us and puts us in the place of the disciples. Christ does not seek us because we're wise or wealthy; our boats don't have weapons for fighting. All he is doing is simply calling us to his shore and to follow his call. These two hymns and readings remind us that while we are not perfect, God knows this and still wants us to follow Him.

The offertory anthem blends all of these themes together in a text going back to the early 1800s, "Dear Lord and Father of Mankind." In the final stanza, the text paints nature and away from the hustle of the world is where we can sit calmly to hear the call of the Lord. This call does not take place in an earthquake, strong wind, or fire, but rather in a still small voice of calm.

This weekend's call of Isaiah and the disciples reminds us that we are also called to live our Christian lives. We, like the seraphim of angels in our first reading, sing in our closing hymn, in endless chorus praising: Holy, holy, holy Lord. If we accept the call of the Lord as did the disciples, we hope to come at last to sing the praises of the Lord, as our psalmist states this weekend, in the sight of the angels.

From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

From time to time I have been asked how to gain a Plenary Indulgence.

In answer I borrow from the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of Redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury and satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living and the dead.

Pope Francis has granted to Our Lady of Mt Carmel minor Basilica special days for the opportunity of a plenary indulgence by the Faithful:

1. May 13th—the day Pope Francis by decree elevated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church to a minor basilica.
2. June 29th the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.
3. July 16th Feast day of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
4. October 7th the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
5. December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, the day of the dedication of the basilica.
6. Once a year on a day freely chosen by each of the Faithful.

The Faithful who devoutly visit the basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite or at least recite the Lord's prayer and the profession of faith may obtain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and the prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff Our Holy Father Pope Francis. **Msgr. 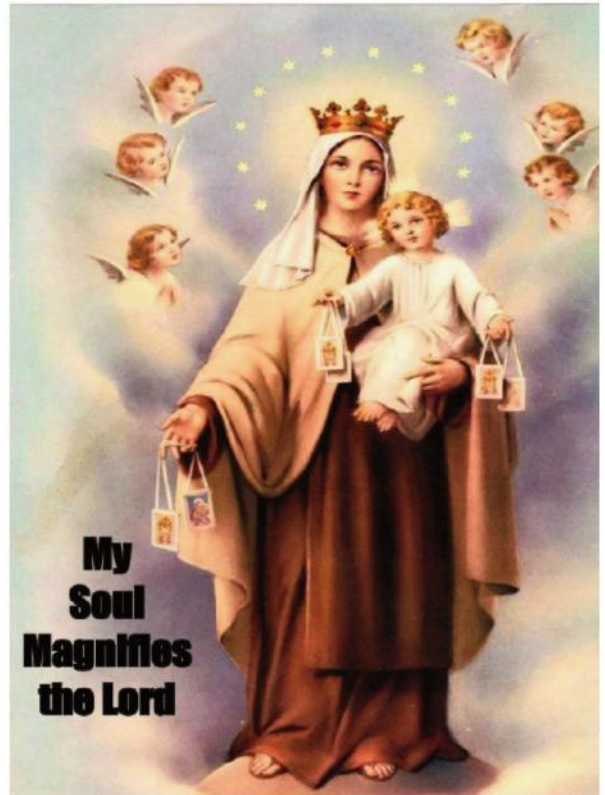
