

THE THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT



Craig's Corner A Note From Our Music Director

"The Lord is kind and merciful!"

This text that we sing this weekend in the year C responsorial psalm summarizes a key point in our Lenten journey: forgiveness and mercy. Monsignor has preached on the importance of going to confession in his homilies this Lent. Just this past week, the basilica offered "The Light is ON for You: An Evening of Reconciliation" event for those who were seeking the sacrament of reconciliation. The CCD students and Youth Ministry of the parish will also be taking part in the annual Lenten mime Stations of the Cross with a communal penance service to follow on April 12, before Holy Week. These events being offered to our parish community show us the importance of the sacrament, especially in this season of Lent.

This weekend, in addition to the psalm, our readings speak of God's mercy because we do fall. St. Paul tells us that what has been written down about our ancestors is a warning to us in the present that we should take care not to fall. In the Gospel Jesus explains to the people that they must repent. He stresses this point by telling a parable about the fig tree that has not borne good fruit in years and so it is exhausting the soil. The man pleads to the gardener that he will cultivate and fertilize the surrounding ground so that it may become a good tree and bear fruit soon and if not, he can cut it down. The gardener is symbolic of the Lord's mercy. So we too, if we take advantage of reconciliation, and use our Lenten season to cultivate and fertilize our lives with Christ, we may lead better lives. We also hear of God's mercy to the Israelites in today's year C first reading.

Our music this weekend continues our Lenten theme of returning to God asking for His help to become better Christians as we seek the Easter mysteries. Our opening psalm, "Be With Me, Lord" (psalm 91), reminds us that God is with us even though we do sin, in times of trouble, and he is there to relieve us of the pain which sin causes. We look upon Him for our healing, ask Him to draw near to us as we take His body and blood in our communion. The sacrament we receive at the altar brings us closer to Him, as does the sacrament of confession.

Monsignor has also preached about the importance of silence during this season. For the remainder of Lent, with the exception of the fourth Sunday (Laetare Sunday), the offertory of Mass will be silent without a hymn. This will allow us more time for silent prayer during Mass as we prepare for Easter. As we ask for His mercy so that we may be a new creation in the new springtime of the Church we await at Easter.

Untold spiritual wealth is concentrated in a tiny drop of blessed water. *And we give so little thought!* Did, we realize now as we shall realize after death, the many benefits which may be derived from holy water, we would use it far more frequently and with greater faith and reverence. Holy water has its great power and efficacy from the prayers of the Church, which its Divine Founder always accepts with complacency. **Following are some of the petitions the priest makes to God when he blesses water.**

O God, the Creator of all things, by water and the Holy Spirit you have given the universe its beauty and fashioned us in your own image. Bless and purify Your Church.

O Christ the Lord from your pierced side you gave us your sacraments as fountains of salvation. Bless and purify Your Church.

O Holy Spirit, giver of life, from the baptismal font of the Church you have formed us into a new creation in the waters of rebirth. Bless and purify Your Church.

PRAYERS EFFECTIVE

These prayers ascend to heaven each time you take holy water and sprinkle a drop either for yourself or for another whether he be present or absent; and God's blessings descend for soul and body. **DISPEL THE DEVIL**

The devil hates holy water because of its power over him. He cannot long abide in a place or near a person that is often sprinkled with this blessed water.

DO YOUR DEAR ONES LIVE AT A DISTANCE?

Holy water, sprinkled with faith and piety, can move the Sacred Heart to bless your loved ones and protect them from all harm of soul and body. When worry and fear take possession of your heart, hasten to your holy water font, and give your dear ones the benefit of the Church's prayers.

THE HOLY SOULS LONG FOR IT

Only in Purgatory can one understand how ardently a poor soul longs for holy water. If we desire to make a host of intercessors for ourselves, let us try to realize now some of their yearnings and never forget them at the holy water font. The holy souls nearest to heaven may need the sprinkling of only one drop to relieve their pining souls.

REMITS VENIAL SINS

Because holy water is one of the Church's sacramentals, it remits venial sin. Keep your soul beautifully pure in God's sight by making the Sign of the Cross carefully while saying, "By this holy water and by the Precious Blood wash away all my sins O Lord."




