

Days of abstinence are days on which we do not eat any meal at all. Dairy products, fish and seafood are allowed. All Catholics over the age of 14 must abstain. The days of obligatory abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, both the laws of fasting abstinence apply and no meat may be eaten.

#### Craig's Corner A Note From Our Music Director

This weekend, our basilica blossoms in rose color as we celebrate our joy, in Latin, *Laetare*. The Gregorian introit which began the Mass on this Sunday in the ancient Church was taken from the prophet Isaiah, "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning." Our opening hymn reminds us that while these forty days of Lent are days of intense prayer, longing for Easter joys, and fasting, they are still forty glorious days. We recall that on this weekend, we can joyfully celebrate that this season of repentance is past its halfway point, and the time to celebrate the saving acts of Jesus are approaching.

This glimpse of extra joy is evident in both postludes this weekend. In both pieces, the Choral Dorien or the Adagio for Strings, start out soft and contemplative but reach a fuller middle before dwindling off again to the original tone. This weekend is about hope, and as most of us will hear in the year C Gospel of the Prodigal Son, mercy. In his encyclical on mercy, the now Saint Pope John Paul II wrote, "Mercy - as Christ has presented it in the parable of the prodigal son - has the interior form of the love that in the New Testament is called *agape*. This love is able to reach down to every prodigal son, to every human misery, and above all to every form of moral misery, to sin. When this happens, the person who is the object of mercy does not feel humiliated, but rather found again and 'restored to value'. The father first and foremost expresses to him his joy that he has been 'found again' and that he has 'returned to life'. This joy indicates a good that has remained intact: even if he is a prodigal, a son does not cease to be truly his father's son; it also indicates a good that has been found again, which in the case of the prodigal son was his return to the truth about himself." The year A Gospel which is read at the 10AM Mass with the RCIA scrutiny, also shows the mercy of God through the healing of the man born blind.

Since the organ is used a little fuller this weekend than we have heard the other Sundays of Lent, may we find joy through our music this weekend, even if just a glimpse of what we will hear on Easter. This glimpse is also why the 10AM Mass Scrutiny revolves around the theme of light. As we go further into Lent and Passion Tide, let us be joyful that these are the saving acts of our salvation. Without the cross, we cannot come to the full joy of the resurrection!

We do not take advantage of the benefits derived from holy water. LET US CULTIVATE ITS USE.

Untold spiritual wealth is concentrated in a tiny drop of blessed water. And we give so little thought! Did, we realize now as we shall realize after death, the many benefits which may be derived from holy water, we would use it far more frequently and with greater faith and reverence. Holy water has its great power and efficacy from the prayers of the Church, which its Divine Founder always accepts with complacency. Following are some of the petitions the priest makes to God when he blesses water.

O God, the Creator of all things, by water and the Holy Spirit you have given the universe its beauty and fashioned us in your own image. Bless and purify Your Church.

O Christ the Lord from your pierced side you gave us your sacraments as fountains of salvation. Bless and purify Your Church

O Holy Spirit, giver of life, from the baptismal font of the Church you have formed us into a new creation in the waters of rebirth. Bless and purify Your Church.

#### PRAYERS EFFECTIVE

These prayers ascend to heaven each time you take holy water and sprinkle a drop either for yourself or for another whether he be present or absent; and God's blessings descend for soul and body.

DISPEL THE DEVIL

The devil hates holy water because of its power over him. He cannot long abide in a place or near a person that is often sprinkled with this blessed water.

#### DO YOUR DEAR ONES LIVE AT A DISTANCE?

Holy water, sprinkled with faith and piety, can move the Sacred Heart to bless your loved ones and protect them from all harm of soul and body. When worry and fear take possession of your heart, hasten to your holy water font, and give your dear ones the benefit of the Church's prayers.

#### THE HOLY SOULS LONG FOR IT

Only in Purgatory can one understand how ardently a poor soul longs for holy water. If we desire to make a host of intercessors for ourselves, let us try to realize now some of their yearnings and never forget them at the holy water font. The holy souls nearest to heaven may need the sprinkling of only one drop to relieve their pining souls.

#### REMITS VENIAL SINS

Because holy water is one of the Church's sacramentals, it remits venial sin. Keep your soul beautifully pure in God's sight by making the Sign of the Cross carefully while saying, "By this holy water and by the Precious Blood wash away all my sins O Lord."


