





#### **CRAIG'S CORNER**

#### A Note From Our Music Director

Throughout the Church year in Ordinary Time, our basilica has had the tradition of singing the *Ordinary* of the Mass in Latin. These parts, the Kyrie (in Greek), the Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei, are the fundamental parts of the Mass and no matter which season of the year we are in, do not change.

Even with the directives of Mass to be celebrated in the vernacular language coming with The Second Vatican Council, Church leaders also directed that the faithful be able to sing these parts in Latin. The leaders recognized the importance of the Latin as well as Gregorian chant in the place in the Mass. In the document, "Sing to the Lord," it states:

The Church recognizes Gregorian chant as being especially suited to the Roman Liturgy. Therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services. Gregorian chant is uniquely the Church's own music. Chant is a living connection with our forebears in the faith, the traditional music of the Roman rite, a sign of communion with the universal Church, a bond of unity across cultures, a means for diverse communities to participate together in song, and a summons to contemplative participation in the Liturgy.

The word *contemplative* is important here. To allow us to pay even more attention to the words of these texts, and some of the others we do in the Latin language (such as the Salve Regina we did last weekend), I have begun doing these without accompaniment in the organ. Chant done a capella has its own unique character and as we unite ourselves with the universal Church, we can sing these texts all the more complete.

This weekend, Christ calls us to spread our peace to others. Saint Francis wrote his prayer which echoed this sentiment which we sing at our offertory this weekend. Christ's message is given as He began His public ministry. His sending out of the seventy-two is mirrored in our call as Christian disciples. Our psalm for communion this weekend, "Go out to the world and teach all nations," was not meant just for these people, nor was it meant for just the twelve apostles. It rings to us as well.

Just as we are called to keep the tradition of Latin ordinary Mass parts, we are called to Christian discipleship and being people of peace. Let that theme of our weekend readings today allow us to go out to the world each day and proclaim our Christian call.

#### FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### SYMBOLS OF THE FOUR EVANGELISTS

Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, the four Gospel writers, or "Evangelists" (from the Greek *euongelion*, meaning "Good News"), are traditionally represented in sacred art by four symbols: Matthew is represented by a human face, Mark by a Lion, Luke by an Ox, and John by an Eagle.

All saints have some symbolism, for instance Saint Peter is depicted with keys (the "keys of the kingdom of heaven" and Saint John Vianney is shown wearing a purple stole (because he was a priest and was known to hear confessions for several hours every day). The symbols of the Evangelists were taken from the four "Living Creatures" of the Book of Revelation.

#### Revelation 4:5-11 (NRSV)

"Coming from the throne are flashes of lightning, and rumblings and peals of thunder, and in front of the throne burn seven flaming torches, which are the seven spirits of God; 4:6 and in front of the throne there is something like a sea of glass, like crystal. Around the throne, and on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, full of eyes in front and behind: 4:7 the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with a face like a human face, and the fourth living creature like a flying eagle. 4:8 And the four living creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and inside. Day and night without ceasing they sing, "Holy, holy, holy, the Lord God the Almighty, who was and is and is to come."

The **human** is associated with **Matthew** because of the focus in that gospel on the power of Jesus' **Incarnation** (his "becoming human") and his Davidic heritage.

The **lion** is associated with **Mark** because Mark's gospel focuses on Christ as a **powerful** teacher and judge, and the lion was traditionally associated with divine power and royalty.

The **ox** is associated with **Luke**, because Luke's Jesus is relatively accessible, kind, and peaceful (in comparison with other gospel portrayals). The ox is a symbol of that 'everydayness' and **useful strength**.

The **eagle** is associated with **John** because John's gospel because it is the most 'mystical' of the four, and the eagle was thought to have the ability to look directly into the sun.
