A Note from our Music Director

When things seem bleak and dismal, you often hear people try to reassure others that things are always worse before they get better or some variant of that phrase. Right off the bat today in the first reading we hear the words from the Prophet Malachi that "the day is coming, blazing like an oven, when all the proud and all evildoers will be stubble and the day that is coming will set them on fire." YIKES. What a way to start off our Sunday readings! Jesus doesn't start off the Gospel passage today much better. He tells us that "all that you see here—the days will come when there will be not left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." He later continues telling the people that they will be seized and persecuted, handed over to prisons. He says "nation will rise against nation, kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes famines and plagues." Again, yikes! (The postlude this weekend draws attention to this dark imagery today).

But neither of these readings ends in such a dark tone. The first reading concludes with, "But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays," while the Gospel concludes with Jesus saying, "but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

It is no surprise that we hear these readings this week as we come very close to the end of our Liturgical Year next weekend. Think of this weekend as the "things are always worse" and next weekend as the "before they get better." While we have a glimpse into being consoled over all the darkness that has to happen before we can attain the kingdom, next weekend we crown Christ as king and celebrate that because of the cross and resurrection, if we persevere through the dark, we will attain paradise.

Our entrance psalm this weekend, Psalm 122 "I rejoiced when I heard them say let us go to the house of the Lord," is a common psalm for the end of time. The text revolves around the "New Jerusalem," the kingdom of God rather than looking to things on earth. In our basilica dedicated to the Blessed Mother, our parish hymn *Immacolata* in the first verse reminds us that it is Mary who guides the hearts of us on earth through whatever tempests life here on earth may bring and that if we call upon her, she is the true star of love.

So as we hear what starts off as quite dark and dismal words this weekend, we are reminded that our true kingdom is in heaven. Whatever natural disasters, wars or negative things happen in our lives, Christ reminds us that our perseverance will secure our heavenly quest. Let us pray that through Christ and His mother Mary that we ask them to guide us through these days on earth so we can find our ultimate goal one day in the kingdom of the New Jerusalem so we can rejoice when the angels say to us, let us go to the house of the Lord, alleluia!
