



A Note from our Music Director

This weekend, the Solemnity of Jesus Christ as King of the Universe, marks the final week of the Liturgical calendar. The Church Year began late last November with the First Sunday of Advent. Through the seasons we have awaited His coming in Advent, we've celebrated Christmas and Epiphany, we commemorated His Passion, Death and Resurrection and coming of the Spirit at Pentecost, and we have heard many parables and teachings of our Lord. As a basilica parish named in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we take time out of our Liturgical Year also to celebrate the Mother of God in a special way. Everything we have celebrated since last Advent culminates in this great solemnity today.

As we sang last weekend about the New Jerusalem, this weekend our readings center on kingly power. We hear of David's anointing as King of Israel in the first reading mirrored by Christ being mocked as the King of the Jews at His crucifixion. But it takes until the last sentence of the gospel this weekend for us to hear where His kingdom truly is. "Today you will be with me in paradise," Jesus tells the penitent soldier. THIS is what kingdom we need to try to attain. Nothing from this world can compare to the paradise Jesus promised the soldier. THIS is the kingdom we sing of. We enter the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass acclaiming Jesus as our Sovereign King: victor, ruler, Lord and Redeemer. Our offertory reflects on the name of our King, Jesus, crowning him Lord of All, just as our closing hymn praises Him on the throne of everlasting glory.

As we culminate this Liturgical Year, and praise our King, our scriptures open before us the future. Not earthly future, but our heavenly future where the Kingship of Christ endures forever.
