HOST:

1 cup lukewarm water
1 cup flour
1 tsp + few drops of oil
Dash of Salt

Beat mixture for 5 minutes. Let stand 5 hours, stirring every half hour. (This recipe is for use with an Ostia maker and if none is available, you may purchase the Ostia at the rectory).

FILLING:

1 Bag of Hershey Kisses or 1 large Hershey Bar
1/2-3/4 lb. skinned almonds
1 pint of honey

OPTIONAL:

Orange extract, grated orange rind or vanilla. Melt chocolate in double boiler or microwave. Add honey at the same time. When all is melted, add chopped almonds and flavoring. Remove from heat and fill host.

CRAIG'S CORNER
A Note
from our Music Director

One of the most familiar melodies of the Advent season is that of "O Come O Come Emmanuel." Many parishes use the *Missa Emmanuel*, a setting of the Mass where the Alleluia, Holy Holy, Memorial Acclamations, Amen, and Lamb of God are set to this tune during Advent. We have a custom to use this Mass setting at Mt. Carmel, and will continue to use that again this year.

The Communion antiphon this weekend, "My Soul in Stillness Waits," is based on the "O" Antiphons, which have been a part of Roman Advent liturgies since the Eighth Century. Also a part of the Evening Prayer in the last days of Advent, these Antiphons use imagery from the Old Testament which proclaimed the coming Christ. We hear of these images (Wisdom from on high, Key of David, and others) also in our opening hymn this weekend, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

The first verse of this antiphon comes from another ancient Roman hymn, "Creator alme siderum." Depending which publisher's translation of the hymn you reference, this hymn is also "Creator of the Stars of Night" or, our translation, "O Lord of Light who Made the Stars." This hymn draws our attention to the dark world that required a Savior, and thus we await the coming of Christ our light at Christmas. The candles we begin lighting this weekend on our Advent Wreath symbolize this light as we add more light each weekend as we approach Christmas. The postlude this weekend is an arrangement of this ancient melody.

Let us all pray that the light of Christ, whom we await for this Advent, be with us all as we begin this season together.

Candy Cane History and Legends

Legend has it that in 1670, the choirmaster at the Cologne Cathedral in Germany handed out sugar sticks among his young singers to keep them quiet during the long Living Creche ceremony. In honor of the occasion, he had the candies bent into shepherds' crooks.

In 1847, a German-Swedish immigrant named August Imgard of Wooster, Ohio, decorated a small blue spruce with paper ornaments and candy canes. It wasn't until the turn of the century that the red and white stripes and peppermint flavors became the norm. *Photo Source: National Confectioners Association*

In Indiana, a candy maker wanted to make a candy that could be a reminder of Jesus Christ, so he made the Christmas candy cane. He started off with a stick of pure white hard candy. The white color symbolized the virgin birth and the sinless nature of Jesus, and the hard candy symbolized the solid rock which was the foundation of the church, and firmness of the promises of God.

The candy maker made the candy in the form of a J, which represented the name of Jesus and the staff of the Good Shepherds. He then stained it with three stripes which showed the scourging Jesus received, and symbolized the blood shed by Christ on the cross. When you break the cane, it reminds us that Jesus' body was broken for us.

Hope is the theme of the First Sunday of Advent. Isaiah describes a future in which all is well because (1) God is recognized as the highest authority and (2) obeying him is the people's highest priority.

This vision gave great hope to the oppressed Israelites. Today if we look at this as a description of heaven, it gives great hope to us, too. When we die, "terms" will be "imposed" upon us (i.e., purgatory) because we did not stay entirely on the paths of God, but we will be living in the light of the Lord after death and there will be no more wars to battle.

Knowing that this is our future, we can look at our present trials as preparations for heaven. The weapons that we use now to defeat and overcome the powers of darkness can be used as plowshares for enriching our soil (our earthly life), bringing us into new growth and producing a harvest in ministry. Sufferings that are turned into

ministries to help others make hardships very valuable.

Although Isaiah was speaking of the coming of the world's Messiah through the Jews, these verses remind us that when we respect God's authority and make imitating Christ our highest priority, all is well for us. Our battles against evil aren't over yet, but Jesus has already won the victory for us. Our hope is not based on a wish for peace; our hope comes from the reality of what Jesus has already done and what he will do. So,



"let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord!" (Psalm 122).

The Gospel reading tells us that our hope is realized only if we stay awake and alert to the activities of Christ. What are you despairing about? Despair and worry are merely distractions that make us forget that Christ has already won the battle. If we stay alert to the presence of Christ, recognizing his authority and following his ways, we live in hope – not wishful thinking, but a hope that's based firmly on reality.

Reflect & Discuss:

1. What are you despairing about?
2. What would it take for you to feel hopeful? In what way do you need Jesus to come to you now? What can you do to become more aware of his presence at your side?
3. How do you find hope in difficulties?
4. Describe a time when you nearly lost all hope. How did Jesus rescue you from this?
