HOST:

1 cup lukewarm water

1 cup flour

1 tsp + few drops of oil

Dash of Salt

Beat mixture for 5 minutes. Let stand 5 hours, stirring every half hour. (This recipe is for use with an Ostia maker and if none is available, you may purchase the Ostia at the rectory).

FILLING:

1 Bag of Hershey Kisses or 1 large Hershey Bar

1 pint of honey

Orange extract, grated orange rind or vanilla. Melt chocolate in double boiler or microwave. Add honey at the same time. When all is melted, add chopped almonds and flavoring. Remove from heat and fill host.

A Note from our Music Director

Merriam Webster defines the word *silence* as "forbearance of speech and noise; absence of sound or noise." Even Church leaders wrote about silence in their documents about music in the Mass. They write,

Music arises out of silence and returns to silence. God is revealed both in the beauty of song and in the power of silence. The Sacred Liturgy has its rhythm of texts, actions, songs, and silence. Silence in the Liturgy allows the community to reflect on what it has heard and experienced, and to open its heart to the mystery celebrated. Ministers and pastoral musicians should take care that the rites unfold with the proper ebb and flow of sound and silence. The importance of silence in the Liturgy cannot be overemphasized.

A synonym for this word is *stillness*. In our Communion antiphon last weekend for the First Sunday of Advent we sang, "For you, O Lord, my soul in stillness waits." This stillness and silence is a major component to the Advent season. Understand, though, that silence doesn't mean sadness; we are to treat this season with joy!

In the secular world, the weeks leading up to Christmas are always busy and hectic – anything but silent and still. The Church in its rich history and Tradition gives us these four Sundays to separate ourselves from this hustle and bustle but rather, silently contemplate the coming of Christ. Our offertory hymn this weekend, "O Come, Divine Messiah," also dwells on this facet of the season: "the world in silence waits the day, when hope shall sing its triumph, and sadness flee away." John the Baptist, from whom we hear in the Gospel this weekend and in our opening hymn, is an important figure to keep in our minds this season. Connecting this theme, this weekend's postlude is a setting of a German Advent chorale proclaiming of the coming of Christ, "Savior of the Nations, Come."

Before and during Mass, especially during this Advent season, let us take advantage of these periods of silence so that we can prepare for the coming of Christ with the absence of the sounds and noise of the secular season we are bombarded with in the secular world.

The first reading describes Christ the Messiah, who came from the line of Jesse, the father of King David. It also describes how to obtain peace – a peace that sustains us even in the midst of troubles: "The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him." Can you feel the Holy Spirit "resting" on you?

We experience true peace when we're in a restful relationship with God, i.e., when we're not struggling against him and his ways and his plans for us. Peace does not depend on bringing to an end the struggles we have with people or the problems we have with financial shortages or addictions or health, etc. We can work hard to accomplish peace in any trial, win the war, and still not be at peace.

Peace comes to us in the wisdom and understanding that we get from the Holy Spirit. Peace comes from following the Spirit's counsel. Peace comes from gaining knowledge of the truth, in total submission, obediently acting upon the truth.

In the Gospel reading, John the Baptist reminds us to "prepare the way of the Lord and make straight his paths." To receive the Spirit of God and his peace, we must prepare ourselves to meet Jesus in the Eucharist and in all the other ways that he comes to us. What kind



of preparation produces peace? It's the work of honestly identifying our sins, happy that God is merciful, and straightening our crooked paths, because we realize that God's ways are really what's best for us.

Whatever separates us from God's peace, we must get rid of it. To do this, we have the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Penitential Rite at the beginning of every Mass. Christ equips us for the journey into true peace!

Reflect & Discuss:

- 1. What turmoil is going on in your life? What has stolen your peace?
- Where is Jesus? What obstacles (e.g., unforgiveness or resentment) do you need to repent of to see him and feel his peace?
- 3. What methods do you use to settle down and rest in the Spirit of Jesus when turmoil is spinning around you? What kind of prayer helps? Do you go on retreat or confide in a spiritual director? What are some other ideas?
