

A Note from our Music Director

Gaudete! Rejoice! The first part of our first reading at this weekend's Mass tells us to rejoice! Our Advent season is beyond its halfway point and the coming of Christ at Christmas is very near. This weekend we light the rose colored candle of the Advent wreath to symbolize this extra joy. Our music reflects this joy this weekend. Our closing hymn, "People, Look East" has a joyous melody which matches the tone of the text, calling for all things on earth, from humans to God's creation, to prepare for the coming of Christ. Just like the birds prepare their nests and the frozen earth awaits new springtime, so must we ready ourselves to receive Christ at Christmas.

Why are we looking east? In ancient Church history, many churches literally faced towards the east. This is the direction the three Magi looked to see the star after Christ's birth. Religious philosopher Origen stated, "the direction of the rising sun obviously indicates that we ought to pray inclining in that direction, an act which symbolizes the soul looking towards where the true light rises." Also, in the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus tells his disciples that "just as lightning comes from the east and is seen as far as the west, so will the coming of the Son of Man be."

Last Sunday and this weekend, Saint John the Baptist is a main figure in our Gospel. Our Communion Antiphon from the Roman Missal reminds us that this Gaudete Sunday is one to be joyful; we should not fear because the coming of the Lord is close; he is coming to save us. Because of this, we, as our opening hymn states, proclaim this joyful message, our God is coming to earth!

Good News INSPIRATION FOR DAILY LIFE

Third Sunday of Advent

Isaiah 35:1-6a,10 Ps 146:6-10 (Is 35:4) James 5:7-10 Matthew 11:2-11

Saturday December 21 Song of Songs 2:8-14 or Zephaniah 3:14-18a Ps 33:2-3,11-12,20-21 Luke 1:39-45 Joy is the theme of the Third Sunday of Advent. As it says in the first reading, "Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vin-

dication to rescue you!" This is the reason for our joy. We have been ransomed from sin and its destruction. This is why Jesus came to earth to be born as one of us: to rescue us from the horrors of an eternal separation from God and his love.

Compared to eternity, our current problems are little, very little indeed.

Joy comes from realizing that, because of Jesus, no sins against us and no destructive forces can do us permanent harm. In fact, God will make good use of everything for our benefit! He defeats evil by making blessings come from it.

Even the worst of times become huge blessings if we let them unite us to Jesus. With Christ and in imitation of how he suffered for the sake of others, we offer to others what our hardships have taught us, and thus our sufferings become ministries. Our sorrows find valuable meaning, which produces a joy that gets multiplied beyond measure.

In Christ we are crowned with everlasting joy. We feel his joy and gladness because of the good that will come and is already starting. Sorrow and mourning will flee



away as we rise above our pain to rejoice in the goodness of joining in the ministry of Christ. And we are lifted up by a faithful and compassionate God.

As the second reading points out, we must be patient while

we wait for the Lord to convert our trials into triumphs. To maintain an attitude of joy, we must remain firm in our faith, not doubting that the Lord is concerned about us. And we must not complain, because complaints mean that we think we know better than God does about how our problems should be resolved and how long it should take.

Joy comes from rejoicing in the good news that God really does care and is of course working on our behalf to produce many wonderful blessings from our sufferings, just like Jesus says in the Gospel: "Blessed is the one who takes no offense in me."

Reflect & Discuss:

- What are you unhappy about?
- Can you find joy in the trial? because God will make good come out of the suffering if you want to use it for the benefit of others.
 Talk to Jesus about that today. What is he telling you? What hug is he giving you?
- 3. Describe a time when you saw blessings come from your sufferings. If you could do it all over again, with the option of avoiding those particular troubles, would you? Why or why not?
