



Jesus, the King of glory, yet like us in all things, comes to his temple to be a light for all the nations.



#### **Presentation of the Lord**

This is one of the oldest feasts of Our Lady. Mary, wishing to obey the Law of Moses, had to go to Jerusalem forty days after the birth of Jesus to offer the prescribed sacrifice of a lamb or two doves. It was in the arms of His Blessed Mother that Jesus offered Himself to his Heavenly father as Mediator and Victim for the redemption of the world. Through, Mary, you, too, should dedicate yourself to God's service by doing His holy will at all times-in-joy as well as in sorrow. Offer the works and sufferings of your life to God through Mary's hands for the salvation of souls, especially your own.

#### THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD



One of the nicest things to hear is when someone compliments your personality, your work and efforts, your cooking, etc., or when someone says something like "isn't your grandmother wonderful?" or something about a family member or friend of yours. With that in mind, put yourself in the shoes of Joseph and Mary in today's Gospel. Simeon and Anna sing the praises of the Christ child who is being presented in the temple by His parents as was the custom of the day.

Simeon prays to God (in a canticle we sing as a part of the Liturgy at the opening of the Masses this weekend) stating that now that he has seen Christ, he can go in peace "for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel," then goes on to tell Mary, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted --and you yourself a sword will pierce-- so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." Luke even tells us in his account that Mary and Joseph were amazed at what was said about their son.

A main theme in this weekend's feast is that of light. We hear about Christ being the light to the Gentiles in Simeon's canticle. The choir anthem this weekend, "Let all Mortal Flesh Keep Silence" denotes this theme well as the text centers on Christ being the light of light descending to us. But no greater hymn in my mind captures today's feast more than our offertory hymn, "Sing of Mary." The hymn blends this feast with what we have been celebrating during our winter Sundays of Ordinary Time. We sing of Mary and her Son who will go forth from her side to preach, to teach, to heal and suffer. This is the Son who, as we hear at the end of Luke's account in the Presentation gospel today, "they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him. This Sunday, 40 days after our celebration of Christmas, we remember what we celebrated just over a month ago of the incarnation of Christ, while realizing now just a few weeks away from the start of the Lenten season, that our minds must always bring focus on Easter - the central celebration of our faith.

We are reminded of this as we sing our communion hymn "One Communion of Love." It blends the theme of light with remembering the sacrifice Jesus came down to earth to accomplish. We are walking in the light of our faith in one communion of love, remembering that the Eucharist is the gift which allows us to partake in God's glory, manifest to us at Christmas, on the road to Easter.

This feast, called Candlemas, while it takes place in Ordinary Time, closes out the Traditional Christmas season in the ancient Church. Pastorale music is common for Christmas celebrations in many classical organ pieces, so this weekend's pastorale during the Blessing of the Throats is a movement of a melody in thirds over a drone bass, recalling the Christmas music of pifferari, players of the traditional Italian bagpipe (zampogna) and reed pipe (piffero).

We now are encouraged to bring the light we have received in Christmas with the decent of Christ to us, and of the blessed candles, we go forth to continue our Liturgical Year to walk in the footsteps of Christ as we continue on the road towards Easter.

#### Saturday February 8

1 Kings 3:4-13 Ps 119:9-14 Mark 6:30-34 Today we recall the consecration of the baby Jesus by Joseph and Mary. Because the infant was consecrated to God, his whole life and even his

death were consecrated to God – for our sake.

Have you consecrated your life to God?

What about consecrating your death to God, too? Even your dying breath can serve God if you ask him to give you the opportunity. What kind of a testimony will your passage from earth to heaven be for those you leave behind?

At your baptism, you were reborn into the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, but have you consciously consecrated your life to him? This is a daily decision, even a moment-by-moment renewal of the decision, not just a onetime baptismal ceremony.

This means being in a con-

stant state of prayer, no matter how busy we are.

It means tuning to God and acting on faith instead of reacting to circumstances.

It means getting in touch with God in our hearts and not letting our heads fool us into thinking we're living on the heart-level when we're not.



tached to in this world, then letting go so that we can become attached only to God.

It means staying spiritually awake. It means deliberately growing in holiness each and every day.



It means continually asking ourselves, in each and every situation that occurs, "Am I experiencing God's love right now? If not, what must I do to unite myself to his love? Am I living in his love right now by giving it to others, even though it might be very difficult to do? If not, I choose to force myself to behave lovingly."

#### Reflect & Discuss:

- A prayer: "Lord Jesus, help me to live the consecrated life. Holy Spirit, make me aware of the times I fail to do this and show me how to re-consecrate my life to You. Loving Father, accept my desire to be consecrated to You, and help me to immerse myself more fully into Your generous love for me."
- Have you consecrated your life to God? Describe what that decision was like. Why did you do it? What changed?
- 3. How does consecrating our lives to God help us grow spiritually? What are some of the struggles we face in trying to live out our consecration?
