





#### CRAIG'S CORNER A Note from our Music Director

As I have eluded to in the past, this weekend we also foster our roots in the Tradition of the Catholic Church in the singing of our Latin Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei. As our bishops state to us in a recent document, <u>Sing to The Lord</u>:

"The Second Vatican Council directed that the faithful be able to sing parts of the Ordinary of the Mass together in Latin. Each worshiping community in the United States, including all age groups and all ethnic groups, should, at a minimum, learn Kyrie XVI, Sanctus XVIII, and Agnus Dei XVIII, all of which are typically included in congregational worship aids. More difficult chants, such as Gloria VIII and settings of the Credo (Creed) and Pater Noster (Our Father), might be learned after the easier chants have been mastered."

This weekend's readings are sort of a prelude to the next two Sundays ahead. Jesus is about to begin to review part of the Ten Commandments, to make the old laws fulfilled to his new followers and begin to outlay the purpose for His ministry. This will aggravate some of the Jewish leaders but this is one of the reasons Christ came to us: to preach and teach the fulfillment of the law. It is all part of the larger "Sermon on the Mount" in Matthew's Gospel.

The laws He preaches can be summed up in one word: love. This weekend He tells the disciples that they are the salt of the earth and, going back to Isaiah, the light of the world. We must shine before others, He tells us.

The words of both the first reading and Gospel this weekend are directly stated out in the entire text of our offertory hymn, "You are the Light of the World." Our opening hymn, "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling" reminds us, also, that as we come to the altar to receive Christ and His teachings each week, that the laws are summed up in our love for each other. If we are true followers of Christ, we will, as the final verse states, become a new creation: pure and spotless. Saint Francis' popular words in his text of peace also sum up this theme "where there is hatred, let me bring your love." If we bring love where we go, rather than division or hatred, then we truly are the light of the world – shining before others in which we glorify our heavenly Father.

Fasting means eating a lesser amount of food. Catholics 18 and not 60 years of age must fast. The days on which we must fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Days of abstinence are days on which we do not eat any meal at all. Dairy products, fish and seafood are allowed. All Catholics over the age of 14 must abstain. The days of obligatory abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, both the laws of fasting and abstinence apply and no meat may be eaten.

Jesus tells us: "You are the salt of the earth." What does it mean to be salt? Think about what salt does. It adds flavor to foods that lack sufficient taste.

Jesus also raises the point that if we lose our flavor, how can it be restored? The answer is: Only by letting God renew us.

In your baptism, you were made flavorful - alive with God's love, peace, joy, etc. Fruitful Christians are those who evangelize by adding the seasoning of God's life -God's love, peace, joy, etc. to the lives of the people around them.

But beware of trying too hard! What happens when food is over-salted? It tastes horrible. No matter how good our intentions might be, if we come on too strong, we do more harm than good.

People are much more likely to turn to Jesus if they first experience his love from us,

and his peace in how we treat them, and his joy in the way we live our lives. They need to discover that Jesus loves them just the way they are, that he is gentle but sincere when inviting them to grow spiritually, and that he can help them turn hardships and troubles into blessings and joys.

Jesus also tells us to be a light that others cannot help but notice - but not a light that blinds. To flavor the lives of others with the presence of Jesus, we have to let his light shine in us. We have to be so lit up by Christ that others cannot help but notice.

Additionally, Jesus says that we have to be a city. We cannot evangelize alone. A "city" is a group of Christians: a parish, a family, a church organization. Being Christian means being in community. When our light is

joined to the light of others, our collective glow is much more effective in revealing Christ to the world. Why? Because non-believers learn that the love of Christ is real when they see us living in love with each other: unconditionally, generously, with a servant's heart (see Acts 2:42-47).

We are the light of Christ for each other. We are seasoning for each other. Without each other, our light dims, our flavor fades, and we become useless to God's kingdom.

### Reflect & Discuss:


- 1. In what ways have you oversalted someone by trying too hard or too often to evangelize? What were the results? What will you do to rectify this?
- 2. What obstructs the light of Christ within you? What in you needs to change so that the people around you can see him better?
- 3. What clues help us identify people whose lives are lacking the full flavor of Jesus' love? How could their lives be seasoned with the love of Jesus that is in you? And in your parish?
