



Jesus is clear—it's the love that you have in your heart that will get you to heaven. Simply following church rules out of obligation, not love, does not put you on the path to heaven. Attending Mass on Sunday and then gossiping about a fellow parishioner on the parking lot is an example of a modern day Pharisee.

One of the reasons Judas betrayed Jesus the night of the Last Supper was because Judas sided with the chief priests, who were so fed up with what Christ was preaching and that Jesus was not the worldly powerful leader that Judas expected him to be. Jesus preached about the poor and lowly, he preached about things against what the chief priests and those who had come before him in the Jewish law had been preaching before Christ. Judas wanted to be part of these influential people – not be alienated from them. Jesus even mentions this weekend as He continues from where we left off in Matthew's gospel last weekend, saying, "unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven." The word "kingdom" and "throne" are important to who Christ is - but they are not the worldly kingdom and throne. Jesus tells us this weekend what we need to do to attain the kingdom that *really* matters - the kingdom of God.

The music this weekend revolves around not the earthly presence of God, but rather God's kingdom of eternity. In our opening hymn, taken from Psalm 90, "O God, Our Help in Ages Past," we hear the sentiment of Sirach's text in the first reading today – that God's wisdom and power are so immense, that He knows everything. Before the hills stood, God was there; a thousand years are just like an evening in God's time: God is timeless and His kingdom stands forever – our eternal home. This is the kingdom Jesus is preaching of. Our offertory hymn, "Blest are They," reviews what Jesus began the Sermon on the Mount with: the Beatitudes. If we want to enter this eternal kingdom of God, we must, unlike Judas, look after the poor, the lowly ones, those who suffer hate. These are the ones who are blessed in the kingdom of God. And as we sing for our recessional, Jesus Christ is the sovereign king. It is His kingdom where we find salvation – not a kingdom here on earth.

As we look forward to the Lenten season, we recall that during the most penitential season of the year, our Masses are void of the word "alleluia." Over the next two weeks, our music will also highlight the word before we "bury" it for the forty days to follow. As we sing "Ti Ringrazio, O Mio Signore" this weekend, we keep this in mind and go forth as we continue to pray and sing God's praises in this Liturgical Year.



Saturday February 22 Chair of St. Peter 1 Peter 5:1-4 Ps 23:1-6 Matthew 16:13-19 The Jewish religious authorities of Jesus' day were often literalists in their interpretation of the Law of God. Jesus, however, gave a deeper meaning to the Law. He placed his focus on the *goal* of the Law: Love.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus explains that we fail to fulfill the Law when our socalled obedience isn't motivated by love.

Jesus completely fulfilled the true meaning of the Law. In doing so, he took upon himself our disobedience and died for us in the most generous gift of love.

As his followers, we also are to be generous with love. Obeying all the commandments – truly obeying them – requires loving God with our whole heart, all the time, and loving others as ourselves.

Jesus explains how to transform literal interpretations of

God's laws into the Law of Love. In each example, he shows that we are to choose the most loving approach to every problem, no matter how difficult.

His first topic is anger: Sinful anger is judgmental and we are judged by this sin. Jesus provides the remedy: Go and do whatever is necessary to be reconciled. This, he points out, is even more important than worshiping God. How genuine can our worship be if anger has replaced love in our hearts, since God is love?



Another example is lust, which is a counterfeit of love because it treats others as objects. And divorce from a valid marriage is a failure to love as Christ loves, who taught that love makes sacrifices and endures hard-


ships. Remarriage, he says, furthers the sin because it's unloving to the spouse of the original union.

Jesus extends this teaching to every area of life. Breaking an oath is unloving. Lying and never intending to keep the commitment is unloving. In fact, the entire Sermon on the Mount, of which this Gospel reading is a part, explains how to love.

#### Reflect & Discuss:

- Were you ever treated unlovingly because of another person's legalism? How did that experience hide the true nature of Jesus?
- 2. What habits do you have that are unloving toward yourself? How do they affect others?
- Recall a time when someone treated you unfairly but you responded with an act of love. How difficult was it to give that love? What were the results?
- 4. Name common ways that Christians fail to obey God. What did Jesus do to make up for those failures? For example, how do you suppose Jesus treats unborn babies who've been aborted or miscarried?
