CRAIG'S CORNER A Note from our Music Director

While every Mass has its own prominence in the Church year, the central celebration in our Catholic faith is that of Easter. Because of its importance, the Church gives us six weeks of the year to prepare during the season of Lent, which we begin this coming Wednesday. The Lenten season is one of sacrifice and penance but also of longing, expectation and quiet. It is not a season of sadness or suffering – it should, rather, bring us joy that we are preparing ourselves to celebrate the saving acts of our redemption at Easter. To foster the penitential nature of the season, there will be no organ preludes, no organ improvisation or instrumental pieces during Mass (rather only quiet, penitential postludes after Mass), and the Church takes away two aspects of Sunday Mass during the season: the Gloria (except on major feast days) and the singing of the word "alleluia."

The theme of this weekend's musical selections are twofold: to accompany the readings of scripture for the day and to accent the word "alleluia" since it will be absent from our celebrations now from Wednesday until the Easter Vigil.

Our readings today continue to focus on Jesus coming to fulfill the law. This weekend He reiterates the law of love. From the beginning of time, in the Old Testament, the Lord told Moses that He is the Lord: we shall live only for Him and His law is love, "you shall love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus fulfills this in the Gospel when He reminds the people in His sermon on the mount that we are not to hate our enemies. Rather, we must love them and show them the same respect we show those we care about most. We belong to Christ, Paul reminds us in the second reading – Christ who is, as we sing in the psalm, kind and merciful: not only to those who call upon Him, but to all.

Our entrance hymn, "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee" invites us to sing of God's love. He is the God of glory and Lord of Love. In the third verse: "All who live in love are thine; teach us how to love each other, Lift us to the joy divine." The choir anthem at offertory also speaks of Jesus' commandment of loving one another as He has loved us. The meditation for this Sunday's prelude is taken from the Ubi Caritas (Where true charity and love dwell, there God is found) chant which is also heard in the choir piece.

But also this weekend, we hear the word "alleluia" given prominence. The 5PM and 9AM offertory solo is filled with the "alleluia" text, as is our closing hymn, "All Creatures of Our God and King," as is the postlude which has "alleluia" right in its title.

As we go forth this weekend and prepare to celebrate Lent this coming Wednesday, we enter the season preparing for the central celebration of our faith: Easter. Let us prepare our inner selves to celebrate this worthily – and take advantage of more periods of silence to foster increased prayer and penance, to quiet our hearts in longing and expectation of the joys of the Easter celebration to come.

Fasting and Abstinence

Fasting means eating a lesser amount of food. Catholics 18 and not 60 years of age must fast. The days on which we must fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Days of abstinence are days on which we do not eat any meal at all. Dairy products, fish and seafood are allowed. All Catholics over the age of 14 must abstain. The days of obligatory abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, both the laws of fasting and abstinence apply and no meat may be eaten.

Saturday February 29 Isaiah 58:9b-14 Ps 86:1-6 Luke 5:27-32 Mercy is the key to understanding this Sunday's Gospel reading. Think of love as the front door to people's hearts. When they close it, mercy is the love that sneaks in through the back door.

In ancient times, if someone gouged another person in the eye, the victim could gather his clan and punish him by wiping out his aggressor's clan. So God gave his people a law that brought them closer to love: If someone hurts your eye, you may do nothing more than the same to him. It was still unloving, but at least it was fair.

When Jesus came onto the scene, he raised the standards: If someone hurts you, don't play fair; give that person love.

When people sin against us, they don't understand that they're closing their hearts to God and his love. But if we give them love, we give them

God through a back door.

This does not mean we are to remain in harm's way. But if we continue to give them love – even if only from afar – we bring God and his healing into the situation.

If someone steals from you or demands something from you unjustly, you can't stop his greed but you can stop him from sinning against you: Let it go, give it to him. And as an act of generous love, give him more! I know it doesn't feel right, but this is what Jesus says *is* right. Divinely right.

If someone asks you to do a chore for

her because she's lazy, prevent it from becoming a sin of cruelty; gladly do what she asks and volunteer to do more.


This plan of Jesus demonstrates, through us, that God's love is superior to everything else. It proves that love conquers evil.

This is what it means to be perfect. Perfection in the Bible means the fullness of love – complete, unlimited, merciful love.

Reflect & Discuss:

- Think of a time when God showed you mercy even though you didn't deserve his love. What did it feel like when he gave you his love anyway? How did it change you?
- 2. Who is currently sinning against you? What good deeds can you do simply and easily even before he or she asks for forgiveness?
- Describe a time when you did a good deed to someone who caused you difficulties. What kind of impact did your efforts make? If you're not aware of good results yet, how did it help you experience God's love?
- 4. How can stopping an abuse be done as an act of love?
