



CRAIG'S CORNER A Note from our Music Director

The Church gives us a foretaste of Jesus' Resurrection in the Lenten season this weekend in the Gospel account of the Transfiguration: Jesus changes briefly in appearance before a few of his disciples. But Jesus tells them not to speak of this event again until he is raised from the dead. Of course, *we* know how the Gospel ends, but imagine being one of the disciples at this time!

Our music this weekend has a twofold purpose: to hold us in the strict disciplines of Lent but also to offer a brief glimpse of this glory the disciples saw. Our opening hymn, "From Ashes to the Living Font," describes the Lenten journey for us, beginning on Ash Wednesday and preparing us for the font of new life at Easter. The hymn continues by praying that we ourselves can become transfigured to new heights as we renew our hearts and minds this season; we, as a Church, desire to journey still through cross and tomb to Easter joy and spirit, fire fulfilled, so that we can be prepared to complete the story of our salvation through Pentecost when we are filled with the Spirit to go forth and proclaim Jesus' name in our world today. Our offertory hymn, "God's Holy Mountain We Ascend," (and subject of this weekend's postlude) reminds us of the significance of the mountain in the Gospel. Not only did Jesus transfigure himself on a mountain, but he also proclaimed many teachings from the mountaintop. For example, it was on a mountain that he multiplied the loaves and fishes, and so we come to recall the festive meal of the Eucharist as well as we ascend to God's holy mountain every time we come to Mass. At communion, we sing our prayer to take this Lenten season ever more serious, asking God to draw near to us as we are guilty of sin, so that we can furthermore be ready to see not just a glimpse of glory, but the full glory of the resurrection on Easter.

In my talk at the Light of Faith and Family last weekend with the youth and families of the parish, we discussed how Lent is a journey. I brought them through the verses of "From Ashes to the Living Font" which we will use as the opening hymn for the remaining Sundays of Lent prior to Holy Week. Each third verse corresponds to the Gospel passage we will hear proclaimed that day. Jesus' adult journey began after His baptism, beginning with the fast of 40 days in the desert and the temptation of the devil which we heard last week. This week, we journey with the disciples to the mountain for the Transfiguration. Then we will hear the accounts of the woman at the well, the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus. Each weekend, we continue our Lenten journey towards the central feast of our faith: Easter, foreshadowed this weekend by Jesus' transfiguration on the mountain.

Fasting and Abstinence

Fasting means eating a lesser amount of food. Catholics 18 and not 60 years of age must fast. The days on which we must fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Days of abstinence are days on which we do not eat any meal at all. Dairy products, fish and seafood are allowed. All Catholics over the age of 14 must abstain. The days of obligatory abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, both the laws of fasting and abstinence apply and no meat may be eaten.

Atop Mount Tabor, the pure light of Christ was revealed, as seen in this Gospel reading. The Father said, "This is my beloved Son; *listen to him.*"


The transfiguration is repeated every time we listen to him and allow our faith to be enlightened more today than it was yesterday. Now it is we who are transfigured! We are transformed into our true identity. What is our true identity? It's our innermost being, which was created in the image of God and baptized into the likeness of God.

We enjoy life much more when we live according to our true identity. For example, how do you feel when you're impatient? Not so good, right? That's because God is patient (see 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 for a description of his true identity and yours), and

when we are patient, we are much happier.

During Lent, by humbly examining how Christ-like we are and repenting from our sins, we let his light consume the darkness within us.

Jesus left his mountaintop experience to fulfill his calling. Following Christ, we too leave our mountaintops to do what God has gifted us to do. Although there is, as the reading from Timothy points out, hardship in living a holy life, we can be comforted by the fact that



after every Calvary there is always an Easter. We can rely on "the strength that comes from God."

Listen. Can you hear what God is saying about

you? It's the same words he spoke about Jesus on Mount Tabor: "This is my beloved child; listen to him/her." What are you saying as Christ's partner in ministry?


Reflect & Discuss:

- As you read the passage from Genesis, how does it feel to think that others could "find a blessing in you"? How does Jesus bless others through you?
- Timothy reminds us of our holiness. Recall a time when you were enlightened by a new understanding of the faith. How did that change your behavior?
- In the Gospel story, because the Father was so pleased with his Son, he affirmed him publicly. How do you know when the Father is pleased with you?

Lenten Activity:

What's going on in your life that you would like Jesus to transfigure? What will you do this week to expose it to Jesus' healing light?
