CRAIG'S CORNER A Note from our Music Director

"I heard the voice of Jesus say, 'Behold, I freely give the living water; thirsty one, stoop down, and drink, and live.' I came to Jesus, and I drank of that life-giving stream; my thirst was quenched, my soul revived, and now I live in him."

Water is essential for human survival and in my meteorological world, one of the first things I learned in my atmospheric science studies is how the world is that nearly 71 percent of the Earth's surface is water-covered, and the oceans hold about 96.5 percent of all Earth's water. Water also exists in the air as water vapor, in rivers and lakes, in icecaps and glaciers, in the ground as soil moisture and in aquifers. The water cycle is something we learn as kids in grade school.

When we come into the basilica or any church, one of the first things we do is bless ourselves with holy water as a sign of our baptism and our need to cleanse ourselves of sin. As we approach Easter, this becomes an even more prominent sign since we start over anew with the new water from the Easter Vigil.

Water plays a vital role in our readings from the Old Testament and our Gospel this weekend. In the Exodus account of Moses with the Israelites complaining about their thirst for water, until they turned to the Lord they were parched. Once they turned to the Lord and sought Him, He provides. In the Gospel, Jesus reveals Himself to the woman of Samaria at a well where, once He affirms that those who drink the water at the well will always be thirsty again, those who partake of His water – the water of everlasting life – will never thirst. Because of her interaction with Jesus, she comes to believe in Him and brings others to believe in Him as well.

The verse above from the hymn "I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say" summarizes these two readings today perfectly. This weekend's third verse of "From Ashes to the Living Font" is another perfect prayer for us:

"For thirsting hearts let waters flow, our fainting souls revive. And at the well your waters give, our everlasting life."

During the Lenten season, as we turn away from our sinfulness and look to Jesus, let us pray these words, that we ask Jesus to give us, not only the water that is essential for human life here on earth, but rather the living water from the life-giving stream where our eternal souls are quenched and revived, so that we, as we hasten towards Easter may continue to live in Him.

The days of obligatory abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, both the laws of fasting and abstinence apply and no meat may be eaten.

Saturday March 21 Hosea 6:1-6 Ps 51:3-4, 18-21ab Luke 18:9-14 What do you thirst for? Thirst happens when we lack something vital. Water is essential for survival, and our bodies signal us when it's time to drink fluids to stay healthy.

Likewise, water is necessary for our spiritual survival, albeit a different sort of water – the living water, which we first received from the baptismal water that purifies us for eternal life.

The Holy Spirit is the Giver of Life. One of the biblical symbols that represents the presence of God's Spirit is life-giving water. Therefore, we can surmise that Jesus wanted to give the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Samaritan woman. Why? It would still be a while before the Holy Spirit descended upon everyone at Pentecost.

She needed the truth; the Holy Spirit is Truth, and Jesus

wanted to give her what she needed for salvation and then share this new life with the people around her.

We only get thirsty when we haven't had enough to drink. Spiritual thirst shows itself in many forms: addictions, loneliness, despair, frustration, self-indulgence, or any other feeling or behavior that's triggered when we lack something that we need or want. And why would we lack anything spiritually? Because, like the



woman at the well, we sometimes fail to realize that Christ is with us. We need to receive a spiritual healing.

How does God give us this healing? He pours his love into us with all sufficiency, but to drink of it, we have to listen openly, like that woman, ready to be changed by the truth.

Reflect & Discuss:

- In the first reading, why did a physical thirst turn into a sin? How does this happen today?
- 2. In Romans 5, grace and hope are mentioned as gifts we receive when we have been "justified by faith" (i.e., when we've repented of our sins and sought forgiveness). How do grace and hope quench our thirsts? How do they help us resist sin?
- 3. The woman at the well eagerly received what Jesus said. Even though he confronted her about her sins, she drank it all in and then, without shame, excitedly told others about her encounter with the Messiah. What need was filled by the truth? What does this teach about how we can help others hear the truth?

Lenten Activity:

What sin or unhealthy habit do you need to overcome so that Jesus is free to quench your thirsts? What will you do this week to hand it over to Christ?
