

EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD TODAY'S FOCUS: CHRIST IS RISEN! LET'S DANCE!\

Our joy at the Resurrection must move our hearts, our voices, and our bodies, until our inner bliss is fully expressed in singing and dancing!

When Mary Magdalene see the empty tomb, she thinks at first that Jesus body had been stolen. The Evangelist spends so time, however, describing the empty linens, something thieves would not take the time to leave behind. We remember when Lazarus (who would die again) was raised, he came forward in his linens. Jesus, who will not die again, has left his linens, like death itself, behind. When the disci-

ples sees the empty tomb and the linens, he "believes" that Jesus has been raised from the dead

and not stolen., but he does not yet fully comprehend the meaning of the Resurrection. Understanding only comes when one encounters the resurrected Lord.
