



CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our music director

The Solemnity of Pentecost is the birthday of the Church. What a fitting weekend for us to gather again as a parish community after these months of mostly being at home. Jesus' first disciples were afraid in the upper room right after the crucifixion and resurrection and kept the doors locked. It wasn't until after the Spirit fell upon the apostles that they received the grace and courage to go out and spread the Word and what had just unfolded before them. We, too, are like those first disciples. Now after a time secluded away and behind the doors of our home, we are now able to publicly celebrate our faith again – renewed especially on this feast where we celebrate the coming of the Spirit; the Spirit which dwells in each one of us to go forth and live out our Christian lives.

As many parts of our lives begin to resemble some sense of normalcy, pretty much everything we were used to doing before the coronavirus outbreak has changed with many restrictions as things open up again. Our Masses are no different. We are celebrating the sacraments on weekends in our parish hall, social distancing signs are all around reminding us of our duties to keep each other protected for a time, and in the music you will notice a few changes to keep us safe.

The main difference you will notice in coming to Mass is the organ which I will be using is a theatre-style electronic organ, rather than of course the main pipe organ which we have in our beautiful basilica. This electronic instrument was a generous donation to the parish and it has made a nice addition to our space in the hall. Secondly, the diocese has directed all parishes to temporarily store and not use hymnals or misalettes. I will be providing the congregation each weekend with a recyclable worship aid containing the refrains which we will be singing and the order of Mass. These recyclable aids will be a one-time use only, and will be enough printed for each Mass. Last but not least, the congregation will be asked to sing simple refrains for our hymns and antiphons for a time to protect each other around you from any particles from extending overly far from each person.

I also again want to take the opportunity to thank my wonderful choir members for all their hard work and dedication through our Liturgical Year. So we can adhere to proper social distancing requirements, I have suspended the choir season until the fall, and will be eagerly excited to welcome them back hopefully with less restriction as the year continues on. Masses through the summer will have some more individual-based pieces and some more instrumental music as well as we pray together as a community. I am very excited to welcome you all back to our home as we follow a "new normal" which hopefully doesn't last too long. As we celebrate this birthday of the Church, may we be ever more empowered by the Spirit and our Blessed Mother, Mary to go forth and live out our Christian lives.



May we continue to Pray for Healing During this time of the Stay Safe Ohio order we ask that you pray for all families who have been affected by the Corona Virus. May the continue to find peace and mercy in the Lord.




