



CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our music director

It is easy to be afraid. All we have to do is go on social media or see countless news outlets and observe what is going on in our world each day. It can be quite scary: from violence to a new virus to all the other incidents and events going on it can be easy to lose hope or get scared.

This is opposite of what Jesus states in the Gospel right away this weekend: "Fear no one." A little further on He reminds us that the only one we should fear is "the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna," not those who can only kill our bodies. This is why Christ tells us to not be afraid. We are worth much in the kingdom of heaven if we acknowledge God alone: **not** the things of this world. Our other readings dive into this concept as well. In the first reading, Jeremiah speaks of the Lord's triumph over those who persecute the just: it is the Lord worthy of praise "for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked!" Saint Paul tries to shed some light on the matter by reminding us that suffering is the result of sin, but the grace of God is what saves us, reiterating the fact to us that we need to ask, as the Psalmist does this weekend, God to answer our needs according to His great love.

Our music this weekend echoes all of these themes. We enter the sacrifice of the Mass praising God as Jeremiah does in the first reading through our entrance psalm "All the Earth." Our other hymns focus on the necessity to not focus on being afraid in our world but rather looking to God. The words of Padre Pio in "Stay with Me, Lord" are a nice connection from our solemnity of Corpus Christi last weekend to these readings this weekend. Through our receiving the Eucharist, which brings us strength to move forward no matter the circumstances around us, though it is easy to abandon the Lord when things go awry. We constantly ask Him to stay with us because we need His strength. Of course, the hymn "Be Not Afraid" speaks volumes to the theme of our Gospel this weekend.

It can be easy to let the summer Sundays in Ordinary Time feel like we are just fulfilling an obligation of Sunday Mass without any "special" feasts or solemnities. But these weekends do more than just fill ordered time (as the name Ordinary Time means). These Sundays are the heart of the teachings of Christ and offer insight into ways we can become better Christians and live out our faith. Let us remember this especially in these days where it is easy to be afraid and lose sight of the true gift of our faith. We must live out our faith, as Jesus tells us this weekend: "do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father."



God News INSPIRATION FOR DAILY LIFE

Saturday June 27 Lam 2:2,10-14,18-19 Ps 74:1b-7,20-21 Matthew 8:5-17 Think of a time when you were in darkness: a sin, for example, or when you felt abandoned by God or your prayers seemed dry and your spiritual gifts seemed covered over. What did Jesus say to you at that time (perhaps through scripture or friends or a homily at Mass)? What did his whisperings tell you? His words and his guidance were good news for you!

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus says: "What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light."

He's calling you and commissioning you and empowering you, through his Holy Spirit, to share your good news with others, so that they can hear him in their darkness. Proclaim it boldly and visibly so that those who want to hear it will stop and listen. Do not be afraid to openly share how Jesus has been working in your life and how he's helped you grow or heal or turn away from sin.

Yes, when we're this bold, some people ridicule us and reject us, like how Jeremiah was treated in the first reading. But the Lord is with you, too, as "a mighty champion," and your persecutors will eventually stumble and fail. Jesus tells us to "fear no one." God takes good care of us.

Jesus acknowledges those who acknowledge him. In other words, when we're insulted or persecuted for our faith, God holds us and comforts us. It's his opinion of



us that matters anyway, and no one else's. Listen to him. In the whispers of the sanctuary of your heart, he's telling you all the good that he sees in you. He's telling you that he appreciates the good you have done. He's giving you good news worth sharing.

Reflect & Discuss:

- What is your testimony? What did Jesus teach you when you were in sin or handling a recent difficulty? Write it down; this exercise will help you feel more confident when you try to share your story with others.
- Practice sharing the testimony you realized during the above personal reflection: Proclaim it first to your community of friends who understand.
- As you listen to the testimonies of others, encourage them: Tell them how their story helps you.
- 4. Make a commitment to go forth and spread the good news. What does this commitment look like? What will you do first to fulfill your commitment?
