



#### CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our music director

This weekend we sung the familiar refrain of the hymn "Lift High the Cross." This hymn lifts up the cross as a symbol of triumph over death instead of an instrument of torture. Let's look into a few verses to drive home my point.

"Come, Christians follow, where our captain trod; our King victorious, Christ the Son of God."

"Led on their way by this triumphant sign; the hosts of God in conquering ranks combine."

"Our Lord once lifted on the glorious tree; as Thou hast promised, draw us all to thee."

"So shall our song of triumph ever be; praise to the Crucified for victory!"

Not one of these verses sound somber or sad. Without the suffering of the Cross we cannot come to the glory and triumph of the Resurrection. I find it ironic that a large part of my time these days aside from my day-to-day work at the basilica and at WKBN, is studying and practicing at home and church, Marcel Dupre's "Stations of the Cross" for organ. A devoted member of our parish is restoring the painting of the stations in our basilica, and next year I am planning a dedication concert. These organ pieces are very advanced and take a great deal of time to learn but truly tell the story of the pain and suffering Jesus endured in His final hours before the crucifixion. I am looking forward to playing this concert for the parish family next year. But my point being, that while the cross is full of suffering and torture, we must never lose sight of the final reward: the Resurrection. Therefore the cross, while surely an instrument of torture and pain, is a symbol of triumph and victory for Christians who believe in the Resurrection.

This weekend we hear Christ tell us that we are not worthy of him if we don't take up our crosses. While our sufferings in this world can be tough, they build us up and bring us to the glory of the final goal: our reward in heaven. Saint Paul's letter to the Romans this weekend also brings this point to fruition by reminding us, "We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him...Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus." We too, are called to live in Christ so that we do not lose our reward.

It is important to remember that although we're currently only asking for congregational singing to be done in the form of refrains, that the texts of our hymns that are sung play an important role in our Masses. Let us take these words of Lift High the Cross this weekend and apply them to the message and remind ourselves during the weeks ahead that our crosses will end in triumph as we live for God alone.



# GOOD NEWS

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus emphasizes the importance of keeping our eyes on him and always making him our top priority. Nothing else matters as much as our relationship with God. This means following Jesus wherever he leads, doing everything his way, all the way, every day, giving him our 100% (no excuses for being mediocre in our faith), laying down our lives in service to others like he did.

Laying down our lives means making sacrifices, such as giving our cup of cold water to someone who's thirsty. It means receiving someone into our busy schedules and listening for the prophet in him; for example: What is God saying to us through this person?

When we refuse to lay down our lives for others, we reject the Cross of Christ and his sufferings, which he submitted to for our sake. This does not mean, however, that we can never say no to others.

Jesus wants to lead us away from the harm of abuse or demands that are sinful or the enabling of unhealthy behaviors. Saying no in such cases is yet another Way of the Cross.

When we truly follow Christ, we can receive all that he is and all that he has for us. When we let go of our fears and personal goals, letting Jesus lead us into new places and new ways of handling problems, we discover new life in Christ.



His ways are always far better than what we had feared would happen.

This is the difference between a mediocre faith and a life in Christ that is full of adventures, miracles, surprising solutions, healing, victories, and realizing how very precious and important we are to God.

#### Reflect & Discuss:

- Who has asked you (either consciously or unaware) to lay down a part of your life for them?
- 2. When have you said no?
- When have you said yes -- and was it worth the sacrifice?
- Why is laying down our lives for the needs or requests of others worthwhile? Share a story from your own life that illustrates this.
