



CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our music director

When we pray, often times it is for a particular event to happen or some type of request. What we often don't think about in prayer is what Solomon asks for in today's first reading: a wise heart full of understanding. He doesn't ask to become rich, he doesn't ask for anything selfish but rather something even bigger: a virtue to know and to be able to govern justly. The hymn which was sung as a solo a few weekends ago, "O Breathe on Me, O Breath of God" echoes this since the hymn prays that the breath of God come upon us, "that I may love the things you love; and do what You would do," and another passage that asks that the breath of God comes upon us that, "my will to Yours incline, until this selfish part of me glows with your fire divine." This weekend's prelude is an arrangement of this melody.

God tells Solomon that this request was pleasing and did as he prayed for. As we look to the Gospel too, we continue to hear of Christ's parables about the kingdom. Jesus tells the disciples that when we enter the kingdom of God, there will be a separation of the righteous with the wicked. The kingdom of God is to be our treasure. If not, then we are counted with the wicked.

Jesus must be our desire. The text of our offertory anthem is a perfect fit for this theme of today's readings. The instrumental version is a common piece for many weddings. There are many different texts to this hymn, but the most popular one is the one that relates to this weekend's readings:

Jesu, Joy of man's desiring, Holy wisdom, love most bright. Drawn by Thee, our souls aspiring, Soar to uncreated light. Word of God, our flesh that fashion'd, With the fire of life impassion'd. Striving still to truth unknown, Soaring, dying round Thy throne.

Priests are considered "Servants of God." In our opening hymn refrain we sang that we ALL are priestly people, kingly people, God's chosen people. We are all God's servants doing His will on earth. Taking this with the text above, remember we must be drawn to Him and strive to the truth and His throne, with our souls aspiring to His will and His light. As we go forth this week ahead, use this as a prayer of understanding and aspiring to greater heights.



Saturday August 1 St. Alphonsus Liguori Jeremiah 26:11-16,24 Ps 69:15-16,30-31,33-34 Matthew 14:1-12 Jesus tells us that the kingdom of God is like a buried treasure, a pearl purchased at all cost, and a net from which the bad catch of fish will be tossed away and the good catch will be valued.

In other words, our Christian lives are a huge cache of valuables. If our treasure chest has any worthless trash, the garbage needs to be tossed away to make room for more valuables. Some of our treasures have only temporary, earthly value, and ultimately they will be worthless unless they're used for the kingdom of God.

The reading from Romans tells us that all things work together for the good of those who love God. As we purge our lives of false pearls and dead fish, we become more like our Lord. We become more useful to the kingdom of God. Even the bad things that happen to us, under the creative hand of our all-powerful, mercifully loving God, get put to good use as polishing cloths that brighten our pearls and bring out from us a better shine.

In the first reading, Solomon could have asked God for great wealth and he would have received it, but he asked for an understanding heart so that he'd have wisdom to rule the nation well. Even though he ruled imperfectly, his reputation as the wisest king on earth



spread throughout the known world and he accumulated great wealth.

This is meant to teach us that when we seek first the treasures of God's kingdom, then we can safely use the treasures of the earth, because God's wisdom guides us in using them for the benefit of his kingdom. The more we love Christ and follow his ways, the easier it is to identify what's really valuable, separate out the junk that does not belong to God, and use everything else for his purposes.

Reflect & Discuss:

- What treasures are buried within you? What pearls of wisdom have you gained, and what did it cost you to learn these?
- Write a list of your many good qualities. How do they prove that the Lord's presence is within you?
- Choose one treasure, gift, or pearl that God has given to you – something that reveals the kingdom of God. How did you discover it or gain it?
- 4. What effect does this pearl have on others?
