



#### HEALING PRAYER OF SURRENDER



#### CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our music director

This weekend's Gospel is a major shift for Jesus' apostles. Until this passage, He was healing the sick, preaching in parables, and proclaiming the new kingdom and a new teaching to the people. Until today, fresh after telling Peter that He will be the rock on which the Church will be built, He throws a curveball stating that it is not a pathway of ease. He tells them He will be rejected and put to death and be raised up. Peter of course is flabbergasted, and moments after being put on a pedestal, Jesus calls him Satan. Jesus continues, saying that for those who follow him, the road is not easy. We will have crosses and must know that the Christian way of life has many challenges but we await our reward based on our conduct. Jeremiah feels the rejection today in the first reading and Saint Paul reminds us in the second reading too that we must discern the will of God and not be conformed to the things of this world.

Often times we think of the Gospels of Jesus foreshadowing His crucifixion during the Lenten season and in the days leading up to Holy Week. But in Matthew's Gospel this foreshadowing doesn't happen right before the crucifixion. Immediately after this passage, the Transfiguration takes place then Jesus continues His ministry in teaching and in healing.

To that end, our music this weekend reflects a little bit of Holy Week, but also lifts up the cross not as a symbol of torture, but of triumph and glory. We open the Mass as we do on many Holy Thursdays singing "We Remember" where we recall that each time we come to the altar of God it is to recall that Last Supper which Christ instituted the Holy Eucharist. Our offertory solo, *Lord, Whose Love in Humble Service* prays that while Christ suffered on the cross, it is us now who wholeheartedly serve each other as Christ did, no matter what the cost of discipleship might be. The first verse states:

Lord, whose love in humble service bore the weight of human need,

Who did on the cross forsaken, show us mercy's perfect deed;

*We, your servants bring the worship not of voice alone, but heart:* 

Consecrating to your purpose every gift which you impart.

Let these words be our prayer as we go forth this week. As I mentioned earlier this summer, I am working on an organ recital for the basilica next Lent based on the 14 Stations of the Cross. Throughout the 14 movements, various themes portraying the final moments of Christ's life appear. The one that stands out to me the most isn't any of the dark themes but rather the theme of redemption which is interwoven throughout the work in various parts. It reminds me often that while the pain of the cross is real, that is not the final word. So with that in mind this weekend let us lift high our crosses (as we sing for recessional) not as symbols of the cost of discipleship but rather as the crosses we bear to attain a more permanent goal of everlasting life.

Today's first reading is one of my personal favorites. I have often felt the way Jeremiah does here I have velled at God. "You duped me. O Lord, and I let myself be duped!" And I allow it again and again. "You knew this would


happen, Lord! Why did you lead me into this trial?" Have you ever felt that way?

Why do we let him do this to us? Why do we trust God even though he leads us into difficult situations? Why do we follow Jesus into giving our help and love to others even though it's going to feel very uncomfortable if not downright painful?

Walking with God and serving his kingdom is an adventure. We can expect the unexpected, and unfortunately in this world that includes suffer-

ing – denying ourselves the opportunity to pursue selfcentered agendas, taking up crosses, and following Jesus all the way to Calvary (but then of course, all the way to resurrection, too, as explained in the Gospel reading).

Because we love God, we offer ourselves as a living sacrifice, like the second reading asks us to do. This is the highest form of worship; it's a spiritual communion that we experience outside of the Eucharistic liturgy of Mass. In union with Jesus, we are the Eucharist.



Jeremiah's As complaint shows us, we can safely complain to God. We can tell him. without getting punished. that we do not like working for him. Complaining to others, however, is a sin because it causes dossip and prejudices and makes God

look bad.

Asking for prayer support during our trials is important, but complaining to others shows how little we trust God. Eventually, we will see the good that comes from our sacrifices, and this is what we should communicate to others.

### Reflect & Discuss:

- How do you feel when you do a good deed and it later works against you? Have you said "no" to allowing it to happen again?
- 2. What brings the healing love of Jesus to you to help you recover?
- What unexpected sufferings have you encountered while giving someone a gift of unconditional love or while doing some other service for the kingdom of God?
- How did you feel about God at that time? Was the cross you carried worth all the hardships? Explain.

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
