

CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our music director

"The psalmist, or 'cantor of the psalm,' proclaims the Psalm after the first reading and leads the gathered assembly in singing the refrain. Persons designated for the ministry of psalmist should possess 'the ability for singing and a facility in correct pronunciation and diction.' As one who proclaims the Word, the psalmist should be able to proclaim the text of the Psalm with clarity, conviction, and sensitivity to the text, the musical setting, and those who are listening."

Liturgical documents on the music direct careful planning and participation in the Responsorial Psalm at every Mass. One thing I have recently tried to bring to more importance in my planning of the Mass is the settings and verses (called psalm tones) of the psalms we sing. I've found some alternate musical arrangements with various new tones to allow a deeper reflection of their texts. The reason is that in another section of Church documents, they state that the Responsorial Psalm, "holds great liturgical and pastoral importance, because it fosters meditation on the word of God."

The psalm should serve to us as a commentary on the readings are hearing proclaim. And just like the lectors and deacons/priests who proclaim the Old and New Testament readings and Gospels to us, the Psalms also are of course taken from scripture and need to have much preparation to the proclamation for all who hear them. Jesus himself prayed these same psalms!

As evident by the music chosen this weekend, the theme of our readings and psalm this weekend focuses on our love for one another and forgiveness. Paul reminds us of the commandment to "love your neighbor as yourself." The first reading and Gospel relate to our handling of those who sin against us and forgiveness. Ezekiel tells us that if we warn others of their sinful ways but they don't change, their guilt will live with them and not the just one. And thus, the psalm reminds us that those of us who hear the voice of God should not harden our hearts but rather be open to changing our lives and look only to the Lord, not testing Him but living as sheep of His flock in His care.

As we go forward each weekend, let us allow the psalm to speak to us in the same way as any other part of the Mass or any other reading. We shouldn't overlook any one part of the Mass as it all is the fundamental aspect of our faith celebrating the Eucharist. Use the psalms in your daily lives as well to enrich the rest of Scripture, and remember when you pray the psalms you're praying the same words that Christ himself prayed! "If today, you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."

Saturday September 12 Holy Name of Mary 1 Corinthians 10:14-22 Ps 116:12-13,17-18 Luke 6:43-49 This Sunday's readings all speak of the need to stand up for what is holy and right and true in a way that invites others to turn away from sin. If we don't, we indirectly play a part in the sins he or she commits, and we will be held accountable (see the first reading).

If we do take a stand against sin but without compassion and mercy and unconditional love, that too is a sin (the second reading).

Jesus shows us in the Gospel reading that in our efforts to stop a fellow Christian from sinning, it's important to rely on our Christian community for advocacy and prayer support.

How?

First, we speak to the sinner. When we know that someone is harming himself and others (all sins are harmful even when we can't see the harm), if we don't try to impart this knowledge to him or her at least once, our silence is un-

loving and uncaring.

Once we've shared the truth, even if the sinner does not change, we're free of any guilt. But we must not stop trying, and so we take one or two others with us in a stronger effort to help the sinner understand and repent.

And if that fails, we try again with still more backing.



When every attempt to help someone has failed, only then do we quit. In reality, it's not us who's walking away. The sinner is the one who has chosen the path of separation. However, remember how Jesus treated the Gentiles and tax collectors (i.e., the outsiders, the separated ones): He never stopped loving them. He still chose to die for them

Reflect & Discuss:

- Whose sins have greatly disturbed you lately?
- What have you done about it? How loving and caring have you been while handling it?
- 3. What bothers you about the way some people have pointed out your sins or the sins of others? How could they have been more compassionate?
- Share the story of a time when someone successfully led another into repentance and growth. Explain why the effort was effective.
