



CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our music director

The Our Father we pray each weekend can often be a part of Mass we overlook because we're so used to it. We recite it (or chant it) so regularly that sometimes the words may not even mean anything to us or we just "go through the motions." While the music, the readings, many of the prayers and the homily all change weekly, the Our Father stays the same. That doesn't nullify its significance.

Continuing where we left off last weekend talking about forgiveness and love of one's neighbor, this weekend we again hear of the theme of forgiveness and as we hear in the first reading, "wrath and anger are hateful things yet the sinner holds them tight." In the Gospel, Jesus tells Peter and those around him that forgiveness never ends: we must forgive those who sin against us "not seven times, but seventy seven times." This is where the Our Father comes in! Each time we pray this we specifically state, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

So do we pray these words every weekend at Mass and actually think what they are saying or do we just go through the motions of the prayer? If we are *true* Christians and come to Mass to partake of the Eucharist and follow the Gospel, we have to take even the difficult teachings to heart too. Forgiveness isn't easy as Jesus' parable of the king and the servants reminds us today. He challenges us, telling us we will be sent to torture unless we forgive each other for wrongs against us from our hearts: *just* like we pray each weekend.

Our music this weekend matches the readings perfectly as we sing of forgiveness in our hymns, "The Master Came to Bring Good News" and "As We Forgive." The text of "As We Forgive" directly states the Our Father prayer while the verses of "The Master Came to Bring Good News" call our attention to the social justice teachings of the Church and living out our call to discipleship in love of one another, brought together by the refrain: "Father forgive us; through Jesus hear us, as we forgive one another." Since we're only singing refrains as a congregation right now during the pandemic, and with this text being so critical to our Mass this weekend, here are the verses of the hymn for you to pray throughout the week:

1) The Master came to bring good news, the news of love and freedom. To heal the sick and seek the poor, To build the peaceful Kingdom. 2) Through Jesus Christ the Law's Fulfilled, The Man who lived for others. The law of Christ is love alone, To serve now all our brothers. 3) To seek the sinners Jesus came, To live among the friendless. To show them love that they might share The kingdom that is endless. 4) Forgive us, Lord as we forgive, And seek to help each other. Forgive us, Lord and we shall live, To pray and work together.

If we want our faults forgiven, Jesus tells us we *MUST* also forgive each other. I stressed last weekend the significance of the psalms at our Masses. Just so, this weekend's psalm reminds us too that, it is the Lord who is kind and merciful, slow to anger and rich in compassion. As we pray these words, and especially the words of the Our Father, let us remember these aren't simply things on the checklist of our Mass, but rather must be lived out in our daily lives as we go forth through the weeks ahead.



Saturday September 19 1 Corinth 15:35-37,42-49 Ps 56:10c-14 Luke 8:4-15 Jesus' message in this Sunday's Gospel reading explains a line from the "Our Father" prayer he had taught earlier (Matthew 6:12): "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us."

The strongest word here is "AS" – the same as, just like, in equal measure.

If there is anyone we have not forgiven, if there is anyone we cannot pray for with love, we'd better keep our mouths shut during this part of the prayer to our Father, who is the Father of all.

Sometimes, it's difficult to forgive because we think "forgiving" means "forgetting". Jesus never said that we must forget what the debtor owes. Forgiveness means remembering – and learning from the memory – without demanding repayment or retribution.

Unforgiveness is a form of punishment: it's payback time. For example, if we remain angry, we hope that our anger or coldness will somehow punish the sinner into re-

pentance. Well, guess what. That never works.

Here's something else we do that never works: holding a grudge to protect ourselves from getting hurt again. Grudges do not free us from the pain of bad memories. It chains us to them.



When we free others from the debts they owe us for hurting us (whether they seek it or not, whether they're still alive or not), we free ourselves and our healing begins – our healing!

It's the most loving gift that we can give to ourselves, as it's a gift of love to others. Even when they don't recognize our gift, God does.

Reflect & Discuss:

- Who angers you because they don't deserve your forgiveness?
- What are you gaining from unforgiveness and resentment? What will you lose if you forgive?
- 3. What is the most difficult part of forgiveness?
- 4. What steps do you take for pushing yourself into truly letting go of unforgiveness so you can find healing? Sharing this with others will spread good ideas that could change someone's life!

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
