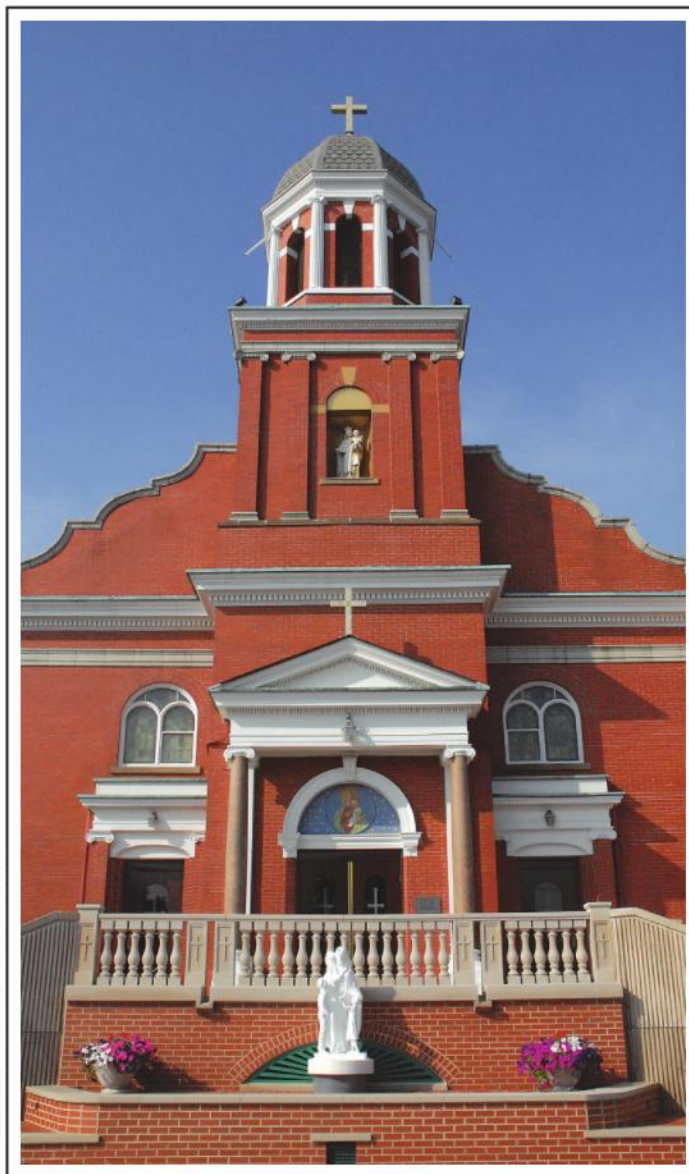

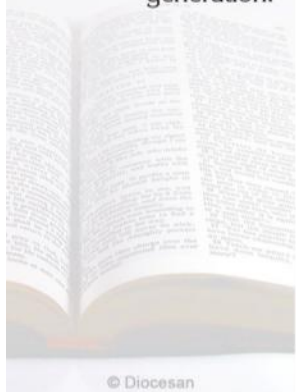

CRAIG'S CORNER

A note from our music director

In recent weeks I have written extensively on the importance of the Psalms at Mass and the significance of the psalms in our prayer life as they date back prior to Christ as Christ himself prayed these same words.

The psalms also offer commentary on each weekend's readings. This weekend I highlight two psalms for our singing. We enter the holy sacrifice of the Mass by singing Psalm 122, "I rejoiced when I heard them say, let us go to the house of the Lord. Alleluia!" This psalm, as many are, is attributed to King David. He wrote this psalm for travelers to the Holy City Jerusalem where the people of God would go for major feasts as a place of worship, some often taking large pilgrimages over many days to get there. For those of us who travel long distances for fun or for work, how rewarding it is once we finally arrive at our destination! So it was for those who traveled far and near to come to the Holy City to be in the house of the Lord. So should we, as we enter and prepare ourselves to celebrate the Mass, rejoice that we are able to be present to celebrate the Sacraments and be in community with our Church family.

At communion, we sing Psalm 34, "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord." This psalm, also attributed to David invites us to our personal encounter with God, most concretely through physical characteristics – in this case taste and sight. While we of course cannot physically see God, we receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist at Mass and physically receive His Son's body and blood. Not only can this psalm be used to invite us to the Eucharist, but it also invites us to see that the Lord's goodness is everlasting.

Tying these both into our weekend readings, we hear both of God's generosity as well as of God's plan. Isaiah prophesizes that God's ways are above all others. We may not often like the path God puts before us, nor do we always understand why things happen the way they do but Isaiah reminds us, it's not for us to understand all the time. Just so in the Gospel, Jesus tells another parable about the Kingdom, where the workers in the vineyard cannot fathom how each of them don't work the same hours yet all get paid the same amount at the end of the day. Jesus tells the disciples through this parable, not to focus on the workers, but rather what the landowner does. He is generous with his money and gives the same amount to each worker regardless of how much they worked. As our Responsorial Psalm states, "the Lord is near to all who call upon him." ALL. God's grace and mercy are with everyone who calls upon Him. God's mercy and goodness doesn't have a time limit, it's always available once we call upon Him. This is God's generosity at work. The last will be first!

Just as the entrance psalm states that we rejoice at going up to God's city and temple, so can our communion psalm be used to describe our physical connection with God through the Eucharist. God's generosity and mercy were so great that He sent Jesus down to us to bring us into His Kingdom so we can physically taste and see His goodness through the Sacraments. In turn, then, we seek to become last on earth so that we will meet Him at the end of our long journey in this world. Then we can rejoice to hear God say that we are welcome to the permanent house of the Lord in the heavenly Jerusalem.
