



CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our music director

At the dawn of creation God formed his wonderful planto include His vast universe and His image man. When light shined in darkness before unending day, Life, Truth, and Love shown like stars to light the Way. And the sons of God shouted for joy as they saw and heard the morning stars sing together God's eternal Word.

These words are the text of the instrumental prelude for the Masses this weekend. They begin by stating God's plan for the world with creation then human existence being in His image. I touched briefly on this "plan" last weekend as we heard the parable of the landowner and his payment to the workers. Not always do we see things the way God sees them. The same thing happens today when Christ tells the chief priests and elders who think they are doing what God wants them to do. Jesus tells them the complete opposite: prostitutes and tax collectors are the ones entering His kingdom! The difference? Jesus reminds them that John heralded His coming and they did not believe in him. Just like Ezekiel was warning in the first reading that those who turn from their wicked ways shall preserve their lives, so Christ reminds the chief priests that sinners were changing their lives for the "Life, Truth, and Love" which is Christ – not them. The aforementioned text centers around how Jesus is "Life, Truth, and Love" to light the way for us, who though sinners, call upon Him for His mercy as we sing in today's psalm.

Our communion hymn this weekend, "No Greater Love" reminds us that if we want to follow this kingdom Christ sets before the chief priests and elders this weekend, that we must lay down our lives for each other in true Christian discipleship. Paul's letter to the Philippians (our offertory canticle too) this weekend shows us what this true discipleship is in the person of Jesus, who humbled himself becoming obedient to death even death on a cross in which God exalted Him – laying down His life for us, His friends.

So as we go forth this week, think of this weekend's Gospel of the two sons and the question Christ portrays to the chief priests, "which of the two did the father's will?" Of course the son who, while not at first, still went and did the father's will is the one who Christ wants us to be. As we sing in our entrance antiphon this weekend, "here I am Lord, I come to do your will, make of me what pleases you." We know what we have to do to please God. We know the cost of true Christian discipleship. God's plan is for us to be with Him forever following His way of life, truth and love. The real question for us though, is do we actually follow the Father's will?

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT:



Guidelines for Preparing and Receiving the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Communion and/or Confirmation

Your child should be at least 7years of age or older and Baptized. They should have completed 2 years of The Light of Faith & Family Formation Program or attended accredited Catholic School prior to receiving the Sacraments.

Families must be registered with Our Lady of Mt. Carmel ~ St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Youngstown, Ohio. A copy of their Baptism certificate is required if the child was not Baptized at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel ~ St. Anthony of Padua Parish.

Parents/guardians are involved in preparing their child for the sacraments.

Confirmation

Prior to preparing and receiving Confirmation, your child needs to have been baptized, receive First Holy Communion and attended 2 years of a structured Religious Education or Catholic School prior to beginning Confirmation preparation.

Missed a Sacrament

If your child missed receiving Baptism, First Communion or Confirmation for one reason or another, call the Religious Education office. It is never too late to receive a sacrament.
