




CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our music director

The word "vineyard" appears to us in today's Scripture readings 11 times between the first reading, the psalm and the Gospel. The vineyard in today's Gospel again is the setting for a parable in which Jesus is talking to the chief priests and elders. He states that different groups of workers were all brought to work on a vineyard but were beaten, bruised and stoned. When the landowner sent his son to the tenants, they put him to death too. The chief priests and elders are infuriated because they of course know Jesus is talking directly to them here (this Gospel takes place following Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday). Jesus of course isn't arrested until a couple days later, but the point of this parable isn't to call attention to Jesus' passion, but rather, gives us another glimpse into how we should live in order to partake of the Kingdom of God. Jesus concludes this passage reminding us that His kingdom will be for those of us who produce good fruit.

How do we do this? One way is to look no further than the example of Saint Francis of Assisi whose feast day would have been this Sunday, October 4 (the Ordinary Time Sunday takes precedence over the saint day). His well-known prayer, "Lord make me an instrument of your peace" offers us many insights on how to bring about the Kingdom of God into our world today. Where there is hatred, showing love; where there is doubt, faith in God; where there is despair, hope, and in forgiving others that we are forgiven so that in our dying on earth we may be brought to life eternal.

The vineyard of the Lord is our home and end goal but God also gives us this world today to use in which to produce good fruit and not filled with wild grapes or made ruin. We, like Francis, must be kind and gentle to God's creation and use what we have on earth to praise and glorify Christ through our words and actions.

Our music fittingly combines these readings and Saint Francis' texts this weekend. Saint Francis' words of praise of creation make up the opening hymn "All Creatures of Our God and King," while of course his even more popular peace prayer text is sung with an alternate musical arrangement as an offertory solo. For communion, as we sing "We Have Been Told," we are reminded that God has told us all we need to do to promote his Kingdom on earth, He is the vine, we are the branches, *and we* must be the ones to bear much fruit.

So as we go forward this week, with the help of the Blessed Mother (who we also celebrate in a special way in the month of October dedicated to the Holy Rosary), inspired by the words of Francis of Assisi, we may ask God to make of us instruments of peace. This way we can build up the Kingdom, bearing good fruit which will last in the God's Kingdom forever: in the vineyard of the Lord.

Guidelines for Preparing and Receiving the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Communion and/or Confirmation

Your child should be at least 7years of age or older and Baptized. They should have completed 2 years of The Light of Faith & Family Formation Program or attended accredited Catholic School prior to receiving the Sacraments.

Families must be registered with Our Lady of Mt. Carmel ~ St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Youngstown, Ohio. A copy of their Baptism certificate is required if the child was not Baptized at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel ~ St. Anthony of Padua Parish.

Parents/guardians are involved in preparing their child for the sacraments.

Confirmation

Prior to preparing and receiving Confirmation, your child needs to have been baptized, receive First Holy Communion and attended 2 years of a structured Religious Education or Catholic School prior to beginning Confirmation preparation.
