







CRAIG'S CORNER A note from our *music director*

"Repay to God that which belongs to God." Words today taken from the Gospel when the Pharisees were trying to get Jesus to say something against Caesar so they had a reason to arrest him and put him to death. Of course, Jesus knows how to respond to them and turn the question back on them.

How do we repay to God that which belongs to God? All of us are called to a ministry in the Church whether it be as an active member or a participant in the Mass from the congregation, or on the altar as a Lector, Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist, Altar Server, or of course in the music ministry!

It's been an interesting year to say the least of course. It was tough having to have Easter with just myself and a very select few people on the altar for our live streamed Masses. It was tough not being able to have our choir and brass music for the Easter celebration. And even when we resumed our public Masses, being limited in what we were singing so as to prevent a further spread of particles in the air. Some churches have done a bit more singing while others have not even allowed for congregational singing in these recent months. I commend you all for your active participation as we have done mostly refrain singing in the past months but I still enjoy hearing your voices lifting up in praise as we repay to God the praise He is due.

I also wanted to take this opportunity to welcome back an abbreviated form of our basilica choir this weekend. After consulting with our members and talking to a few new interested voices, we have resumed singing beginning this weekend at the 11AM Mass. I have talked to a few members who are staying back for a bit of time still, but will be keeping a schedule of members so that we don't have more than 5-6 members at a time in the loft so that we can still adhere to the proper guidelines in the choir loft. But it will be nice getting back into a little more sense of normalcy since our choir season ended so abruptly earlier this year.

I want to thank my gracious members who, like all of us, have dealt with so much adversity this year. Even those who are not in an active ministry in the Church on a liturgical basis, we all have a responsibility to actively participate in the prayers, responses, and hymns of our beautiful Liturgies. We, at Mass and in the world we are a part of every day, must actively give our lives to God and repay to Him that which belongs to Him.



Saturday October 24 Ephesians 4:7-16 Ps 122:1-5 Luke 13:1-9 In the Gospel reading, when Jesus asks the Pharisees to tell him whose image was engraved on the

coin owed for the census tax, he uses it to teach a lesson about the image that should be engraved upon our hearts. Our hearts should belong to God and to God alone.

The Romans believed that

their emperors were divine. Therefore, to possess Roman coins meant carrying around the graven image of a human god. The Pharisees knew this when they challenged Jesus.

Paying the census tax to Caesar symbolized more than just submission to a foreign government. It had religious connotations. If Jesus was a true prophet, he should speak up against Jews possessing pagan coins. If he was a true messiah, he

should deliver them from the oppression and taxes of the foreign government – or so they thought.

We don't know how they happened to have the Roman coin that they showed to Jesus. If they pulled it out of their own purses, which is likely, it revealed their hypocrisy. However, Jesus wasn't just interested in exposing their hypocrisy; he wanted to make a point about the True Messiah. If we belong to God, Jesus is engraved upon our hearts. We have been rescued from the destruction of



sin by the Messiah. We have let him deliver us from the oppression of evil that was caused by our sins.

Whose image do others see when they look at your life? When people see you, do they see Jesus engraved upon you? To the extent that they do, that's the extent to

which you belong to the kingdom of God!

- How do you know that others see Jesus in your life? What's the evidence?
- 2. What have they told you about yourself that is also a description of Christ?
- 3. What are some of the ways in which Jesus has come into your life and changed you from within?
- 4. How has that changed the way you live?
- 5. How does this evangelize the people around you?
