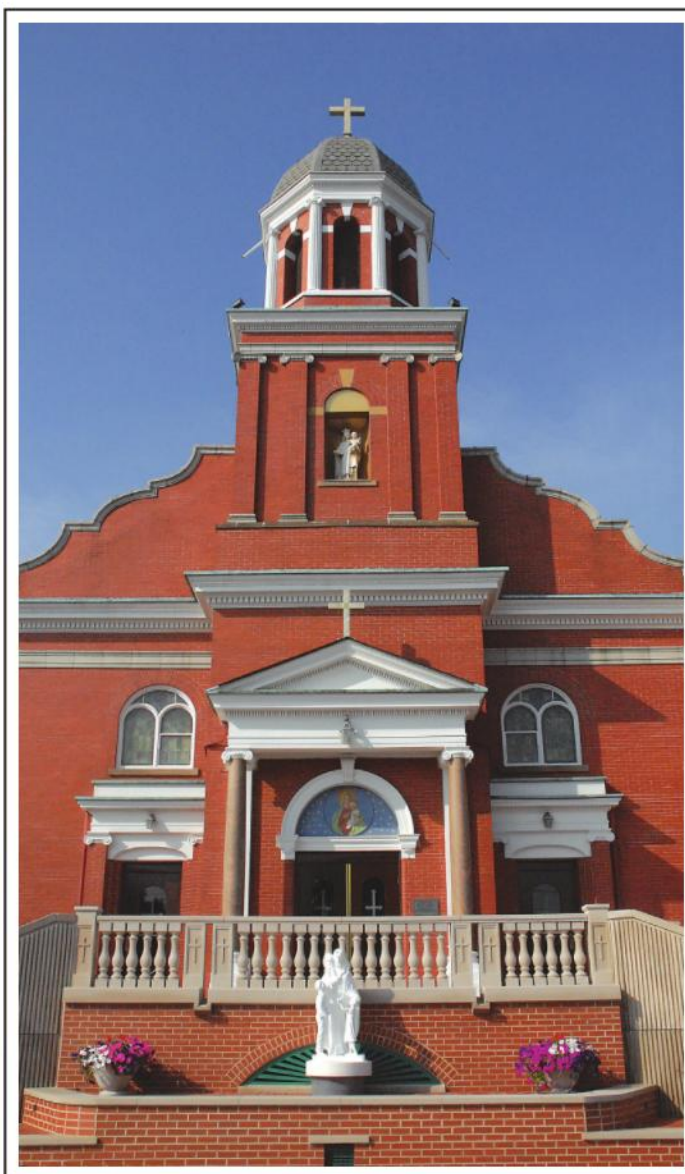

CRAIG'S CORNER

A note from our *music director*

In the time between the triumphal entry into Jerusalem and the Crucifixion, we see in Matthew's gospel many accounts of Jesus and the Pharisees and elders of the Jewish law where they continually try to test him so that they could find reason to put Him to death. We've heard these accounts in recent weeks and today is another one where they continually try to test Jesus. This time they ask Him to tell them what is the greatest commandment. Of course, we know in the Jewish law how much clout THE Ten Commandments took, so they were trying to get Jesus to say something which is contrary to what they had been taught for many years prior to this conversation. Jesus of course knows what they are trying to do and replies with the fundamental truth to our Christian living: love of God and love of neighbor. By stating these things, he is going neither contrary to the Old Testament, but also is making a summary of His Christian message too.

Of course, we know Jesus didn't come to be a political Messiah, he called tax collectors and fishermen to be the disciples, he ate with poor people, with sinners, and with those who everyone else cast aside. That is also our call to discipleship too. As we heard last weekend on World Mission Sunday, our call as Christian disciples is to be in solidarity with those who need us the most. In today's First Reading, we hear from the Book of Exodus, the Law which the Pharisees in the Gospel would be very familiar with. Jesus is simply reiterating the law of the Lord from the Old Testament: you shall not oppress an alien, you shall not wrong an orphan, nor those who don't have enough clothes on their back. Sounds pretty much like "love your neighbor as yourself" to me! These things sometimes seem difficult. Our human nature often finds itself wanting to be with those who have money or status, not those who are outcast in our society. It is only when we place our love firmly in God that this all falls into place.

I wanted this weekend's music to focus entirely on this message of love of others and that if we devote ourselves to our true Christian calling of discipleship, everything else will fall into place. Our entrance hymn, "At That First Eucharist" invites us to the celebration of Holy Mass that as we recall the Lord's Supper each time we come to Mass, but also we pray as verse 1 states, "and in our hearts your law of love renew." Renewed each week in the Eucharist means nothing if we don't follow the law of love throughout the week. This is why the Eucharist strengthens us in our spirituality. Our offertory and communion texts directly state Christ's words of love and His commandment to love one another.

So let us put our trust solely in God. If we, as we hear in this weekend's psalm, love the Lord our strength, and He will be our rock, our fortress (the inspiration for the prelude and postlude this weekend) and everything else we need will fall into place. We will be able to truly care for our brothers and sisters in the world and live out our call to true Christian discipleship.

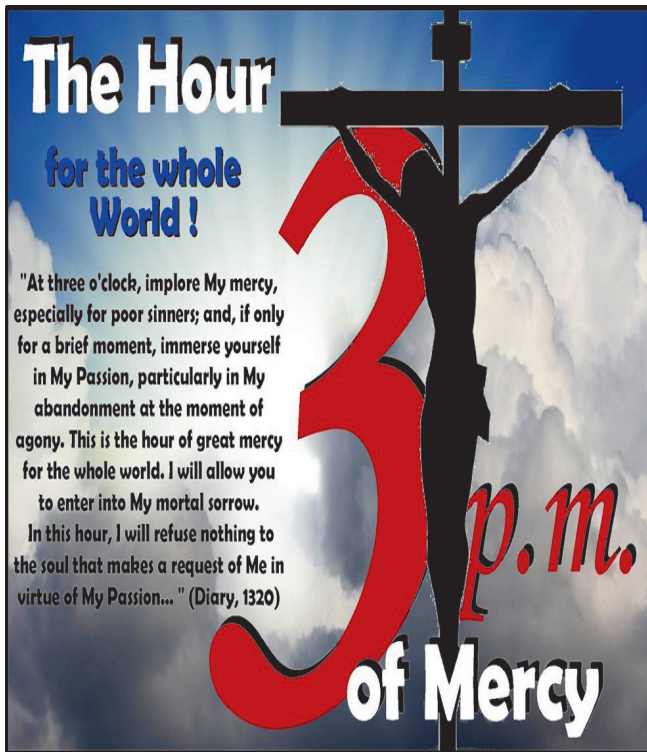

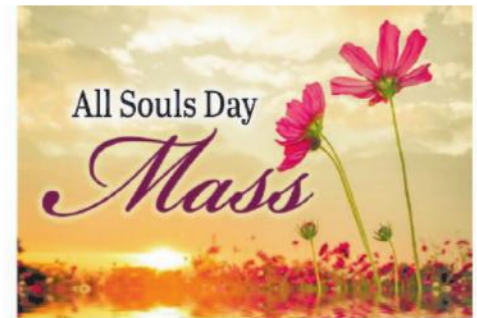
World Mission Sunday

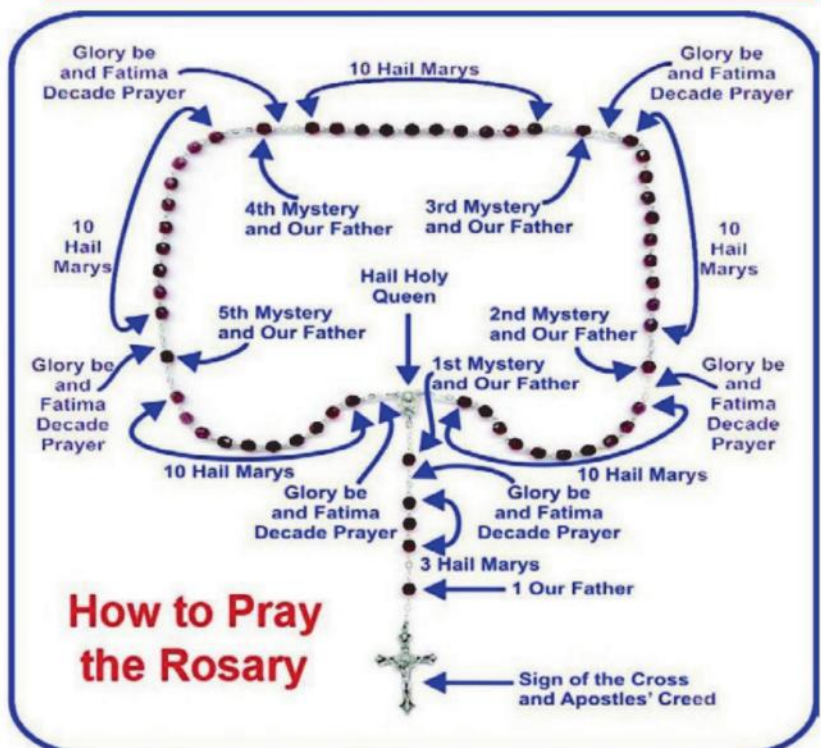

Today's Gospel reading reminds us that we cannot love God without loving ourselves *and* others, but God must always come first.

When we have difficulty loving God with all our heart, mind and soul all the time, every day, every moment, no matter what's going on, it's because we're spending too much time focused on other people and/or on our own plans and wishes.

Yes, we must focus on others in order to love them. And yes we must focus on our own needs so that we can love others *as much* as we love ourselves. Our own needs are important and we are responsible for seeing that our needs get met; otherwise we don't have enough to share with others—enough energy or enthusiasm or kindness or patience. Likewise, we

shouldn't focus so much on ourselves that we neglect the needs of others.

So the question then becomes: What are the priorities? In other words: How much time should we spend alone with God? How much time should we spend nurturing ourselves? How much of our time and needs and wants should be sacrificed for the sake of others?

Interestingly, we find the right balance only after we put God first and make our relationship with him our highest



priority. This divine friendship is what heals us in our unmet needs. It's what empowers us to love others even when they are difficult to love. And we don't have to be alone with God all day to have intimacy with him.

We love him first and foremost simply by relying on him for success in loving others and ourselves. If we keep turning to him for guidance, healing and strength, we are loving him with all our heart, mind and soul all the time, every day, every moment, no matter what's going on.

1. How good are you at setting priorities and keeping God at the top?
2. What puts your priorities out of order?
3. What can you do to increase God's role in your everyday life?
4. Describe some of the techniques you've used to increase God's priority in your everyday life.
5. How has focusing on your relationship with God helped you to be more loving to yourself and kinder toward others?
