ST. TERESA OF JESUS, VIRGIN AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH **FEAST DAY, OCTOBER 15**



Known to her family as Teresa de Cepeda y Ahumada, she became the reformer of Carmel, mother of the Discalced Carmelite nuns and friars, "spiritual mother", patron of Catholic writers (from 1965) and Doctor of the Church (1970), the first woman with Saint Catherine of Siena to ever receive this last title.

Her life needs to be understood in the light of the plan which God had for her, with the great desires experienced in her heart, with the mysterious illness to which she was subject in her youth (and with the ill health from which she suffered throughout her life), and with the "resistance" to divine grace for which she blamed herself more than she should have.

Saint Teresa is among the most important figures of all time for Catholic spirituality. Her doctrine on the unity of the soul with God (a doctrine which was intimately lived by her) follows the Carmelite tradition.

As Carmelites We live our life of allegiance to Jesus Christ and to serve Him faithfully with a pure heart and a clear conscience through a commitment to seek the face of the living God, through prayer, through fraternity, and through service.

All of these we live under the protection, inspiration and guidance of Mary, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, whom we honor as "our Mother and sister"
