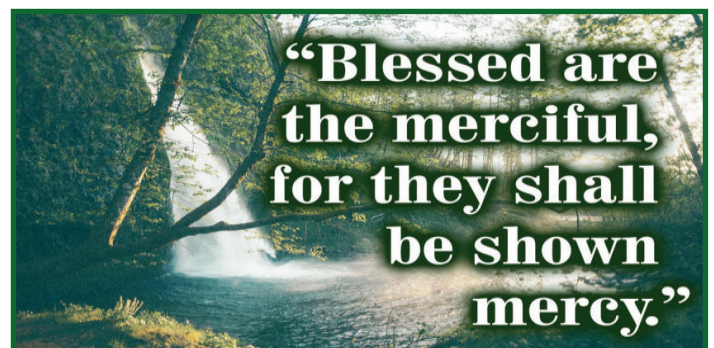

CRAIG'S CORNER

A note from our music director

This weekend we break away briefly from our Ordinary Time green to celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints. When a solemnity of great significance falls on a Sunday during Ordinary Time, the solemnity takes precedence over the Ordinary Sunday Mass. This solemnity is not just important because we honor the lives of those who have finished their call to holiness and have done it well, but because we also need to learn from their example and do our best to imitate their lives each day. That is everyone's call to, as we heard last weekend, love our neighbor and God. In his book on Mother Angelica, a prolific worker for the Catholic television network EWTN, author Raymond Arroyo stated that "The final mark of a saint is not perfection, but lived virtue. It is the striving for holiness throughout the arc of a life that makes a saint." We are all capable of striving for holiness and for living lives of virtue.

Anyone who has followed my musical journey at least semi-closely in these last twelve years since I began taking up organ in my final year of high school in 2008, knows how deeply spiritual some organ pieces have allowed me to grow. One such piece that I "premiered" at the basilica was back in 2011. The first time I played "Incantation pour un jour Saint" by Jean Langlais, I got many compliments for the intense piece that it was while on the other hand I got many complaints about it being too loud and being too dissonant. I have since played the piece on multiple other occasions in the years past and it never fails I get very similar reactions. But often times, our critique of something comes from a lack of knowledge of the topic. The theology and the imagery which this organ piece portrays is from the heart of our Catholic Liturgy. Allow me to explain.

At the most basic level, this piece contains direct quotations from the Easter Vigil Liturgy and the Litany of the Saints (exactly why it is being played this weekend). In a deeper level, we hear Invocations and litanies, the two elements that alternate for the whole first part of the work. To respect the liturgical rubric of the "Lumen Christi" and response "Deo Gratias" of the Easter Vigil, Langlais adopts an ascending harmonic scheme each time the invocation is repeated. The second section of the piece, *vivo con fuoco*, uses a new melody taken from the Litany of the Saints, the fragment "Peccatores te rogamus audi nos" calling for the risen Christ to liberate humankind from evil. Here the style breaks completely from what preceded, as the organ pedal incessantly repeats the new chant fragment. To close, Langlais brings back the "Lumen Christi" of the beginning, concluding with a majestic "Deo Gratias" which triumphs in the pedal with a D-major chord, unexpected yet in retrospect, nothing more normal than this triumphant major. In the words of the composer himself: "Isn't it logical for a musical conclusion celebrating the God's mercy to humans, despite their sins, in the light of Christ?"

So while we fail, we invoke the saints in the litany to pray for us so that we may strive for the holiness they *have* attained. That is what this solemnity is all about.

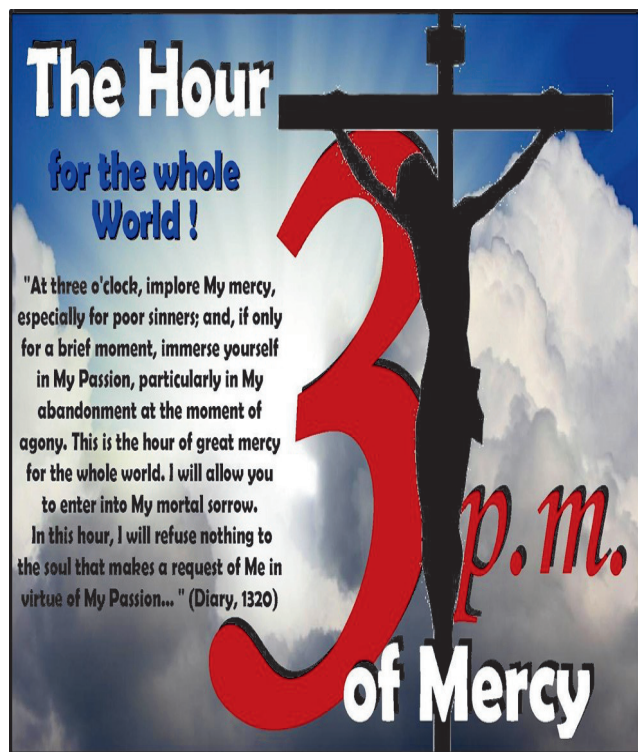

Preparing and Receiving Reconciliation and Communion

*Your child should be at least 7 years of age or older and Baptized. They should have completed 1 year and currently involved in their 2nd year of The Light of Faith & Family Formation Program or attending an accredited Catholic School prior to receiving the Sacraments.

Families must be registered with Our Lady of Mt. Carmel ~ St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Youngstown, Ohio. A copy of their Baptism certificate is required if the child was not Baptized at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel ~ St. Anthony of Padua Parish.

If your child missed receiving Baptism, First Communion or Confirmation for one reason or another, call the Religious Education office. It is never too late to receive a sacrament.

Parents/guardians are involved in preparing their child for the sacraments.

The most asked question is, "Who can be a Godparent?"

*Must have 2 Godparents or 1 Godparent and 1 Christian Witness. A Christian Witness must be Baptized in a Christian Faith and active in their faith.

You are a saint! A saint is anyone who's either in heaven or on their way to heaven.

As followers of Christ, we have been redeemed from sin. We have been reborn as "saints" and are no longer "sinners." Yes, we do sin every day; we have not yet perfected our sainthood. So we grow in holiness by learning to become more fully who God created us to be.

Today's first reading could be describing a huge prayer meeting in heaven, but it's not just about the after-life. You, right now, are part of that "great multitude" when you worship God enthusiastically. Every time we praise God, we're joining ourselves to the whole communion of saints, including our loved ones who passed into the after-life in the Lord's arms.

We're also united to them after our sins are absolved in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, for then we, too, have "washed our robes and made them white in the blood of the

Lamb." Until the next time we sin, we're on the Lord's mountain, standing in a holy place, because our hands are sinless, our hearts are clean, and we are not desiring what is vain (as the responsorial Psalm says).

As the second reading points out, we are saints because we are God's children. The saints in heaven have the advantage of being free from evil, while we live in a sin-filled world. But notice how we become pure: The hope (i.e., belief in God's promise) that eventually we'll



behave like Christ all the time should energize us to purge unholiness from our lives today. This hope is based on knowing that Christ redeems us from sin, the Father forgives us, and after death, whatever clean-up still remains to be done, it will be accomplished thanks to purgatory.

The Church canonizes saints so we can have role models and so we know they're available for prayer support to assist us on our journey to heaven. May we learn from their example -- not to compare our lives to theirs, for we all have different circumstances in which to grow in holiness, but to be blessed by their spiritual guidance.
